

Blaze destroys Salem plant

SALEM (UPI) — The Woody Furniture Co., in downtown Salem was destroyed by a roaring fire which started shortly before midnight Saturday.

Crews had the blaze under control in about 2 1/2 hours, but mopping up operations continued through Sunday and a standby crew was left at the scene Sunday night.

Cause of the blaze was under investigation and owner Don Woody said he would have to go through his books to estimate damage. An unofficial estimate valued the building at \$200,000 and furniture stock at \$500,000.

The concrete and wood building was completely gutted. Four floors of rugs, furniture and appliances were up in flames or were left in charred ruins.

Extension of closure noted

SALEM (UPI) — Forest closure regulations were extended today to the entire coastal area from Westlake north to the Columbia River, the State Forestry Department announced.

Closure regulations are now in effect for the Coast Range and the Cascades generally from the southern border of Lane County to the Columbia River.

The regulations make it mandatory to halt forestry operations when the humidity drops to 30 per cent.

BOY'S THUMB RESTORED

EDINBURGH, Scotland (UPI)—James Cowie, 7, came home Friday night with the thumb missing from his left hand and told his mother he had caught it in a gate.

The boy's parents rushed him to a hospital. Doctors found his thumb in the gate and grafted it back on to his hand.

No progress in lumber talks

PORTLAND (UPI) — Federal mediators reported no progress toward ending the Northwest lumber strike today, although there were no indications it would spread beyond the 19,000 workers now idled.

Mediator George Walker said he had made no progress toward bringing the International Woodworkers of America (IWA) or the Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union (LSW) together with representatives of the "Big Six" of the Northwest wood products industry.

The unions are on strike against St. Regis Paper Co. and U. S. Plywood Corp., and are locked out at Weyerhaeuser, International Paper, Rayonier and Crown Zellerbach. Both unions have filed charges of unfair labor practices.

A judge in Montana Saturday issued a temporary injunction forbidding a strike by LSW locals against St. Regis plants at Libby and Troy, Mont. It will be in effect at least until a hearing is held Thursday.

Walker said the LSW has bargaining sessions scheduled with two large independent firms, Simpson Timber Co. and George Pacific Corp., here Wednesday and Thursday. The IWA is scheduled to meet June 24 with Georgia Pacific and the next day with Simpson.

High-flying U. S. balloon brought down

CHICO, Calif. (UPI) — A high-altitude balloon, launched from the Air Force Cambridge Laboratory near Chico 25 days ago, was brought down by radio command Sunday as it approached the Russian coastline north of Japan.

The 54-foot-diameter balloon, designed to determine whether the new plastic mylar was feasible for future launchings, passed its test successfully, according to officials of the Cambridge laboratory.

The flight originally had been scheduled for 30 days, but was ordered down by radio command five days early because the balloon was drifting out of radio contact.

During the 25 days it was in the air, the balloon remained at 80,000 feet. It first traveled toward the Hawaiian Islands, then was pushed by prevailing winds back over the western United States, north over Alberta, Canada, and then west over British Columbia and across the Pacific.

Officials gave its final location as about 300 nautical miles south of the Kurile Island group off the Russian Kamchatka Peninsula.

Accidents take lives of five

Five persons lost their lives in traffic accidents in Oregon during the weekend.

Richard Anderson, 19, Dallas, Ore., and Sherrie Wendell, 16, Salem, were killed Sunday afternoon when their car collided head-on with a truck on State Highway 22 about 15 miles west of Salem.

Ernest Norris, 66, and Roy Stewart, 55, both of Eugene, were killed late Saturday night in a one-car accident on U. S. Highway 99 10 miles south of Albany.

Norris was deputy director of civil defense in Lane County. Stewart was the commander of the American Legion post in Eugene.

Cheryl Lewis, 17, Redmond, died in a flaming one-car crash on U.S. Highway 126 about 10 miles east of Redmond late Saturday night.

Woodburn youth gunshot victim

WOODBURN (UPI)—Jack Herbough, 15, Woodburn, died in a Portland hospital Sunday night from an accidental gunshot wound.

Authorities said the youth was struck in the forehead with a .22 caliber bullet while target practicing with some friends near his home south of here.

WHITE DROWNS

—Marion Allen, 19, White Salmon, drowned while swimming in Ray's Pond three miles north of here Sunday.

Allen, who was employed by the U.S. Forest Service, was swimming in the reservoir with a friend, Thomas Comer, 19, also of White Salmon, when he disappeared 20 feet from shore.

His body was recovered by a skin diver in 25 feet of water about two hours later.

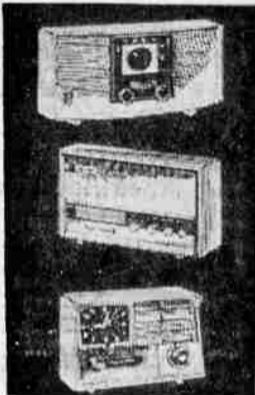

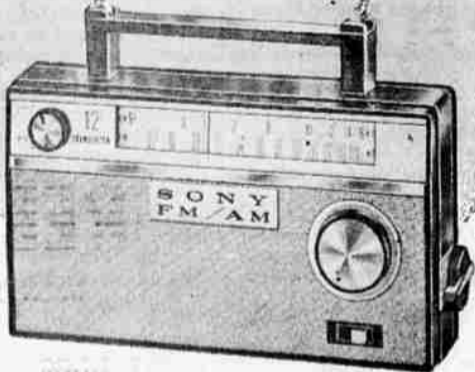

German revolt is recalled

BERLIN (UPI) — Bonfires burned on the East-West border today as symbols of German unity and of solidarity with East Germans whose "bread and freedom" revolt was crushed by Soviet troops exactly 10 years ago.

The fires, lit in the West during the night, set off a day-long observance of the 10th anniversary of the 1953 revolt in the West as "German Unity Day."

Long log drive ends on Sunday

LEWISTON, Idaho (UPI)—The longest log drive in recent years ended Sunday when 60 - million board feet of timber floated into the Potlatch Forests, Inc. mill pond here.

The drive started May 6. Potlatch Forests is one of the few lumber firms in the nation which still brings its logs to the mill in a spring drive.

Officials of the firm said they expect to have another drive next year, but the days of the log drives are numbered. When work gets underway on Bruce Eddy Dam, the Clearwater River will no longer be passable for the lumberjacks.

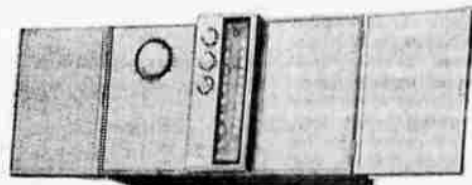
