

1964 U.S. Olympic alpine team to train on Bachelor

Bachelor Butte, white and tall on the western skyline as seen from Central Oregon these late spring days, is definitely in the national spotlight.

The old volcano facing the scenic Three Sisters from the east will be the site of the Olympic alpine team training camp this summer, in late July and early August, as American skiers train for international competition at Innsbruck, Austria.

American Junior National Championship competition will be held on the snowy slopes of Bachelor in 1964.

This was the word brought to Bend over the weekend by members of the group that attended the United States Ski Association's 59th annual convention in San Francisco and submitted the successful bid for the national races in 1964.

A member of the group, O. B. Williams, ex-Skiway president, was named to the United States Ski Association's 23 - member board of directors.

Attending the convention in San

Francisco were Williams, Dr. and Mrs. Robert L. Cutler and Dr. and Mrs. Lowell Applin. Earlier, the Pacific Northwest Ski Association directors meeting in Wenatchee, Wash., had recommended to the national that the 1964 junior races be held at Bachelor Butte.

Members of the Bend delegation, attending the San Francisco conference, directed their attention to obtaining the Olympic ski training for Bachelor Butte, and in this they were successful.

Spout Springs, Oregon, was the choice of the national delegates for the Nordic Olympic team training and selection in November.

Jean Saubert of Lakeview was named a member of the 1964 Olympic ski team and will train at Bachelor Butte this summer.

At the San Francisco meeting, Harry Fruend, Santiam Ski Patrol chief and Oregon State University professor, was runner up to the nation's top volunteer ski patrolman.

The group meeting in the California city recommended formation of an American Ski Council.

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USC wins Injury-ridden UO still captures 3rd

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (UPI) — The 42nd annual NCAA track and field championships, won by Southern California for the 22nd time, had its heroes in USC's Julio Marin and Rex Cawley and Stanford's Larry Questad. But, it also had its disappointments.

Marin and Cawley provided rookie coach Vern Wolfe's USC Trojans 42 of the 61 points that won the team title going away and Questad provided Stanford a surprising 18 of the 42 points the Palo Alto, Calif., Indians made in nosing out de-throned Oregon for second place.

Two of the biggest disappointments, oddly enough, were in the USC camp where Larry Stuart, who owned the year's best javelin throw, failed to qualify for the finals, and Kevin Hogan, touted as a sure point-getter in the 800-yard dash, also flunked his first trial test.

But, as it turned out the Trojans didn't miss those lost points a bit as Marin became the darling of the meet by winning the 6-mile in 30:32.9, the 3-mile in 14:24.9 and finishing fourth in the

3,000-meter steeplechase. Cawley ran on fortitude to win the 440-yard hurdles in 49.6 seconds and push Ullis Williams of Arizona State to the tape in a 45.8 quarter-mile dash.

Another disappointment — especially to hopeful Oregon — was a first night injury to Mel Renfro that could have cost the Webfoots anywhere from 16 to 20 points since he owned the second best broad jump and high hurdles times in the nation.

Questad had a hand in contributing to another disappointment as he boosted his own stock by turning in a stunning defeat of Arizona State's Henry Carr in the 100-yard dash in 9.7 seconds — an event in which Carr has a 9.3 pending world mark.
