"Then the hometown people can watch the annihilation of the hometown boy," the undefeated Louisville slugger said Wednesday upon his return from London, where he stopped British Empire champion Henry Cooper in five rounds Tuesday night.

Clay wants to challenge Liston before mid-December because he has dreams of becoming the youngest boxer ever to wear the heavyweight crown.

Nimrod prospects are good

By and large, fishing prospects in Central Oregon look good for this weekend, a report from the local Oregon State Game Commission said today.

In brief, the picture looks better in the Bend district than in the Ochoco.

Ochoco: Ochoco Reservoir is good for trollers. Prineville Reservoir is fair for trolling but poor bank angling. Walton Lake is fair to good evening fly fishing. The Crooked River below and above the Prineville Reservoir is producing good catches of large trout. Pelton Reservoir is fair to good on troll. Fishing for bank anglers is only fair in the Cove Park and Warm Springs areas.

Bend: Elk Lake is good for kokanee using bait. East Lake is good using bait, including eggs and worms on troll or still angling. Paulina Lake angling is improving using eggs or trolling with flatfish.

A few rainbow up to three pounds are being taken in early morning on troll in Davis Lake. At Wickiup Reservoir, there have been good catches of rainbow, eastern brook and kokanee by using light spoons and bait or trolling with flies. Angling is improving for rainbow by trolling with bait at Big Cultus Lake.

Angling has been slow at Big Lava Lake, but some eastern

brook are being taken on troll and with bait. South Twin Lake angling is fair using bait. North Twin Lake finds trolling from fair to good using flatfish. Blue Lake is fair to good on troll or with fly. Suttle Lake is fair to good for kokanee.
