# Selection of Pope writes happy end to angry week

When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, the man who was elected to succeed him was relatively unknown. But seemingly at the last moment the name of Angelo Cardinal Roncalli was added to the list of the "Papabili," the Italian word used to describe men of the Roman Catholic Church as papal possibilities. And the election of Cardinal Roncalli was something of a surprise, primarily because of the advanced age of the gentle priest who in his reign as Pope John XXIII electrified the world with his energy and imagination. Back in 1958 the man considered most likely to become the 26th pope was well known. He was closer to Pius XII than any priest. And he had served with distinction as the Vatican's pro-secretary of state.

**Received Red Hat**  
Pope John recognized the abilities of this man, who in following years had become archbishop of Milan, and gave him the red hat of the cardinal. And when the beloved Pope John died, again this man once more became the favorite choice. On Friday, Giovanni Batista Montini was elected Supreme Pontiff and will be known to history as Pope Paul VI.

**Know the Papacy**  
He was an expert in diplomacy. As pro-secretary of state he was schooled in protocol and his knowledge of the papacy was encyclopedic. Also he was an Italian. At that time the only other leading candidate in the Papabili was Gregory Cardinal Agagianian, a saintly priest, but he was an Armenian and four centuries of tradition blocked his way to the throne of St. Peter. All of the popes in the last 400 years have been Italians.

**Big welcome for JFK set by W. Berliners**  
BERLIN (UPI)—West Berliners plan to give President Kennedy a real Broadway welcome when he visits here next week, but police have instructed them to please omit flowers (in bunches) and phone books. Old newspapers are already being shredded into confetti in offices overlooking the 40-mile route along which the President will pass, and a department store is doing a land-office business in paper U.S. flags.

**Runaway pair in seclusion**  
MIAMI BEACH (UPI)—The teen-age daughter of Venezuela's millionaire ex-dictator and her handsome but penniless American boy friend applied for a marriage license Friday, then ducked into seclusion for the three-day waiting period required by law. The young couple applied for the license at the courthouse in Key West less than 24 hours after they were traced to a \$5-a-night motel in suburban Hialeah.

**Doctor charged with abortions**  
EUGENE (UPI)—Dr. Hjalmar Gentle, 64, Eugene, was arrested by city police here Friday on two charges of manslaughter by abortion. Dr. Gentle was named in secret indictments returned by the Lane County grand jury Wednesday. He was released on \$1,000 bail on each charge. He was accused in the indictments of performing illegal operations Sept. 27, 1961, and May 9, 1962.

**Big lien filed against hotel**  
PORTLAND (UPI)—Andersen-Westfall Construction Co. of Portland Thursday filed a \$1,207,211 mechanics lien against the Hilton Hotel and the Metropolitan Hotel Corp. It was believed the largest such lien ever filed in Oregon. The big construction firm filed the lien as a prelude to a possible lawsuit to collect the money it said was due as a result of additional work caused by structural changes in the Portland Hilton Hotel after work had started.
