Tacoma scores 2 runs in last three games, but stays atop heap

The Tacoma Giants scored only two runs in the past three games but today they still are on top of the northern division of the Pacific Coast League.

The Giants garnered a 2-1 decision over Seattle in the second game of Sunday's doubleheader after being held scoreless in two previous contests. They lost the opening contest 10-0.

The second place Spokane Indians kept breathing down the Giants' neck but it took them 10 innings to down San Diego, 4-3, and remain 1½ games behind Tacoma.

Rangers Slip
In other games Salt Lake City and Portland split their twin bill, the Denver at Oklahoma City game was postponed due to wet grounds and Hawaii edged Dallas-Ft. Worth 7-5 on a two-run homer by Ron Samford. The loss dropped the Rangers into a tie for the southern division lead with San Diego.

Islander pitcher Ed Thomas, trying for his 10th complete game of the season, needed help in the ninth from Bob Duhon but got credit for his 8th victory. Gary Dotter was the loser.

Four double plays helped the Giants to victory over the Rainiers and gave Phil Hanks his first victory against two losses in his first starting role since May 5. The Rainiers outthrew the Giants 9 to 6 but almost every threat was erased by twin-killings.

Mickey Wright becomes 4th to accomplish feat

MADISON, Wis. (UPI)—Mickey Wright packed her golf clubs and first prize money of \$1,200 today and headed east after becoming the fourth woman in the 34-year history of the Western Women's Open golf tournament to win the title twice in a row.

The 29-year-old Dallas, Tex., blonde, leading money winner in the Ladies Professional Golfers Association, coasted to a nine-stroke victory Sunday over Kathy Whitworth, Jal. N.M., in the 72-hole tournament. Miss Wright carded a one-under-par 73 for a four-round sub-par total of 292.

Miss Whitworth finished with 301, four strokes ahead of the early tourney leader, Marilyn Smith, Tequesta, Fla.

Miss Wright carded three birdies in building her second consecutive Western Open crown.

She left today for the Carvel, Long, Island, N.Y., tournament and then plans a golf-filled two-week vacation over her home course at Dallas.

Big Sky loop wants bowl

BOZEMAN, Mont. (UPI)—The Big Sky Conference is interested in post-season bowl games for its football champion, League Commissioner Jack Priel said at the conclusion of a two-day conference meeting Saturday.

"It would be presumptuous of us to approach other conferences for a possible bowl tie-up at the present time," said Priel. "However, if any possibilities look good to us, we'll be interested."

The new commissioner, basketball coach at Washington State for 20 years, also discussed the possibility of a pre-season basketball tournament for league members. It would be necessary to invite two guest teams to make up an eight-team field.

One of the chief actions of the athletic directors and faculty representatives of the conference's six schools was to establish a commissioner's office at Pullman, Wash.

They also adopted conference football and basketball schedules through 1970 and approved a North-South baseball playoff beginning next spring. Constituting the Northern baseball division will be Idaho, Gonzaga and Montana.

The Southern Division will consist of Montana State, Idaho State and Weber. Divisional winners will meet in a best 2-of-3 series for the league championship.

Promoter Harry Markson of the Garden said today: "We were so impressed with Stabile's great fight — under heavy fire from Scott's left hooks — that we would like to use him with Griffith, if possible. Otherwise with former champion Luis Rodriguez."

Stabile was favored at 13-5 as he and Scott entered the ring. Each weighed 147 pounds, the class limit.
