

Disguised actors reveal identities at end of film

NEW YORK (UPI) — John Huston's latest film, "The List of Adrian Messenger," might best be described as a baroque version of that television guessing game, "To Tell the Truth."

At movie's end, Huston doesn't exactly say, "Now will the real such-and-such please stand up," but that is the moment of truth when five of Hollywood's biggest stars rip off their disguises and reveal the fan magazine faces known to millions.

In the 90 minutes or so that precede this shock of recognition, Kirk Douglas, Frank Sinatra, Tony Curtis, Burt Lancaster and Robert Mitchum speak around like members of the FBI's "ten most wanted" club.

Double Confusion To compound the confusion involved in this "who-is-it" Huston has put together a picture in the finest tradition of the "who-done-it."

Thus the movie mystery addict has two things going for him: He can concentrate on piecing together the jigsaw patterns of the plot and, as an exercise in diversion, he can study the screen for clues leading to the assumed identities of Douglas, Sinatra, Curtis, Lancaster and Mitchum.

Most actors, especially those who reach the hysterical status of stardom, can't seem to find enough ways to expose their mugs to a fickle and forgetful public. Taking established stars and hiding them behind a mess of putty and over-make-up disasters is like featuring Brigitte Bardot in a 19th Century costume drama.

A New Trend? And so, the question arises, is this a new trend toward self-effacement? "I hope not," said Douglas the other day over lunch. "What would happen to our star system?" It was Douglas' company, Bryna Productions, which produced the picture, and so Kirk assigned himself to the task of asking the other guys if they wanted to get in on the act.

Tongue Point proposal made

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Wayne Morse, D - Ore., proposed Tuesday night that the vacant Tongue Point naval facility at Astoria, Ore., be used as a federal vocational training center for jobless workers and school drop-outs.

Morse told the Senate the White House had assured him it will try to find another federal use for the station, which the Navy has abandoned. The Oregon senator also said he is investigating the original cost of construction of the base. U.S. officials have estimated its cost at slightly more than \$14 million. Morse said, but other sources indicate it cost "at least \$40 million."

Board votes racial study

PORTLAND (UPI) — The Portland School Board voted Monday night to appoint a citizen's committee to study the city's racially imbalanced public schools. The decision was a victory for Oregon leaders and for Portland's Citizens' Committee on Racial Imbalance, which asked the board last month to see if schools with an overwhelming Negro majority were hurting the educational opportunities of students.

Accord reached on cut in aid

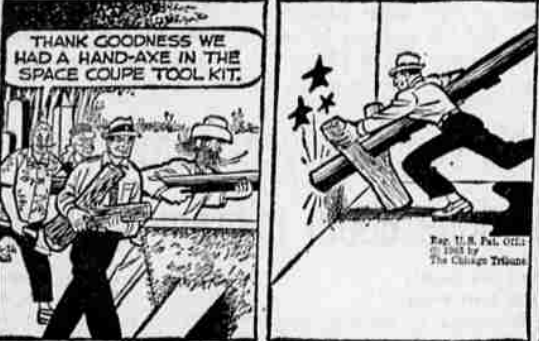
WASHINGTON (UPI) — Key members of the House Foreign Affairs Committee have agreed on a \$400 million cut in President Kennedy's \$4.5 billion foreign aid bill but will resist further slashes, it was learned Tuesday. Informed sources said the White House has decided it can live with the smaller program, clearing the way for the House group to approve the scaled-down figure in the next few weeks.
