

Bean says CD still on way out in Portland

PORTLAND (UPI) — City officials made it clear today that civil defense is still on the way out here.

"No matter what anyone says," it is being dropped, said City Commissioner Ormond Bean.

City officials met informally last Friday with Stuart L. Pittman, national CD director. Pittman indicated the federal government might be able to provide matching funds for a local city-county disaster organization but that a full-time coordinator would be necessary.

City officials said the CD program would be "frozen" as of July 1 but that many details, including disposal of equipment, remain to be settled. City and county officials have discussed forming a disaster relief organization.

Accidents take lives of four

At least four persons died accidentally in Oregon Tuesday.

Thomas Voorhees, Corvallis, drowned near Nye Beach on Tuesday afternoon. He had gone on an outing with his wife and baby.

Voorhees' wife said she saw him bobbing in the surf and two girls on the beach aided her in pulling him out. Artificial respiration failed.

Voorhees, 31, recently had gone to Corvallis from Vanderbilt University to join the Oregon State University staff as an anthropologist. He was a graduate of the University of Arizona and was scheduled to receive a doctorate from Stanford at the end of the summer.

Glen D. Bell, 52, of South Beach, died Tuesday night when his car plunged over a 70-foot embankment four miles north of Florence. His wife, Olga, was hospitalized. Her condition was reported not serious.

Chester L. Philpott, 53, Harrisburg, was crushed to death when a tree he was cutting west of Valsetz in Polk County fell on him.

Mrs. Barbara Fast, 78, Beaverton, was killed when struck by a car near Portland.

At Longview, Wash., Clifton D. Morris, 57, Vancouver, was killed when a log-loading machine ran over him at a log-loading dock.

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Keefe Brasselle, who Tuesday night began an hour variety show replacing Garry Moore this summer on CBS-TV, had a 1962 special in which he was privileged to see Liberace dance.

As for the show, the parlay of Miss Gabor and then Miss Streisand was a tipoff to the imbalance of the evening. It must be rated a so-so first outing, but not without promise. Though Brasselle is no powerhouse singer, dancer or actor, the background of his parents in vaudeville and his feel for this type of entertainment give indication of a good pinwheel host. But the visiting talent and the material, also up and down, must be pruned and cut specifically to his directions.

Among his regulars is Ann B. Davis, formerly Bob Cummings' television sidekick, and she is solid support as a comic singer and actress, though Tuesday night's material gave her only a part chance. With Fred Gwynne, late of the "Car 54, Where Are You?" series, she did a short laughing song that was a gasser. Another regular is ex-boxer Rocky Graziano, who also had some sad jokes at first but wound up with a soulful version of the song "When A Gypsy Makes His Violin Cry," which left this viewer in a state of total collapse. It was marvelous.
