**Fair, warmer weather ahead**

Fair and warmer through Friday.

Indicating that the forecast is correct, clouds cleared from interior Oregon skies last night, but held to their ramparts in scattered parts of the southern Cascades well into the morning.  
Especially happy with the forecast of fair and warmer weather were tourists and other vacation-

ists. Most vacationists in the Cascades have been camp-bound, result of frequent showers and wet woods and meadows.  
Duschnutes foresters reported this morning that their forecasts call not only for rising temperatures, but lowering humidity marks that may bring a renewal of the fire danger.  
In recent weeks, most lookouts and fire protection units have been engaged in varied project work in the forest. Today, lookouts were moving back close to their stations.
