**Sikes, Schlee head public links semi's**

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (UPI) — John Schlee, a towering salesman from Memphis, Tenn., keeps a date with destiny today when he tangles with defending champion Dick Sikes in the third round of the National Public Links Golf tournament.

Schlee, as hot as the 90-degree-plus weather Wednesday when he was seven under par while winning two matches, has been waiting for two years to get another crack at the all-conquering Sikes. "He beat me in the semifinals in 1961," said Schlee. "The score was 2-1. But I'm playing much better. I've been waiting a long time to get even."

It should be a good match. Sikes, who also owns the NCAA par in trouncing Dave Hellman, Waukegan, Ill., 6 and 5, and then beating John Kurach, Detroit, 5 and 4. Schlee turned back Jim McMurtrey, San Leandro, Calif., 3 and 2, and then walloped Paul Franke, Louisville, Ky., 5 and 4.

There were 16 men who teed off in eight matches this morning and there will be only four left when the quarter-finals are completed tonight.

Among the men who could be mighty tired by then is John Sniffen, a 27-year-old Hawaiian playing out of Everett, Wash., where he is a sergeant in the Air Force.

Sniffen went seven extra holes before beating Hung Soo Ahn, another Hawaiian, on the 23rd hole in the first round match. He did it with a birdie. Then in the afternoon he disposed of another toughie, Leroy Beasley of Dallas, Tex., 3 and 2.

SALEM (UPI)—Jerry Mowlds of Portland and Harvey Hixson of Cottage Grove met in the 36-hole final round of the Oregon Professional Golfers Association match play tournament at Ilaha Hills Country Club today.

Mowlds eliminated two-time champion Larry Lamberger Sr. Portland, 3 and 1 and Jim Peter-

sen, Vancouver, Wash., 3 and 2 in Wednesday's quarterfinal and semifinal action. The assistant pro at Portland's Riverside Golf Club finished second to Bob Duden in this tournament last year.

Hixson, runner-up, in 1959, scored a 6 and 5 victory over Ken Irwin, Salem. In the morning round and came back with a 3

and 2 win over Jim Warner, Klamath Falls, in the semifinals. Petersen had beaten medalist Duane Bergstrom, Lebanon, 2 and 1 in the quarterfinals. Warner advanced to the semifinals with a 1 up win over Harold West of Tualatin.

**Cassius wants over a million**

NEW YORK (UPI) — Manager Bill Faversham is demanding indirectly that Cassius Clay, Kentucky's "mighty mouth," get more than \$1 million at the age of 21 for his 20th professional fight.

That's the Faversham platform today in the negotiations for a Sonny Liston-Cassius Clay heavy-

weight title match at Philadelphia's Municipal Stadium Sept. 30.

Pilot Bill is demanding "more than 20 per cent of all net proceeds." He didn't say how much "more."

Negotiations will be resumed Monday or Tuesday by telephone, said Faversham today as he headed back to Louisville, Ky., after Wednesday's five-hour conference at a New York hotel with President Bob Nilon of Inter-Continental Promotions, Inc.

Nilon is a brother of Jack Nilon, advisor to champion Liston. Although brothers Bob and Jack are not associated in the Inter-Continental Corporation, Bob does share Jack's confidence that Liston will keep his crown on July 22 in his return fight with Floyd Patterson at Las Vegas, Nev.

Accordingly promoter Bob is moving briskly with plans for the September extravaganza. And it is Bob who disclosed that he already has offered Clay the equivalent of \$1 million in "20 per cent of all net proceeds from the fight."

Net proceeds are those that go to the promotion after all taxes have been paid on the gross gate

and radio money, and after the promotion gets its share of theater-television money and movie money from exhibitors and distributors.

Bob Nilon estimates that the total net receipts, including a net \$600,000 gate, will be about \$5 million and that Clay's proffered 20 per cent of that net would be "a million bucks."

In discussing the Mischak-Ficca trade, head coach Al Davis said that he felt "we must have more experience in our forward wall and we think we have it in Mischak. We traded away a fine young prospect in Ficca, who will undoubtedly develop into a good ball player in our league."

Ficca, former USC star, was a Raider rookie last year. Mischak, ex-Army star, is a 6-year pro veteran.

Meanwhile, the Raiders opened their pre-season training camp Wednesday with the arrival of 26 rookies and 6 veterans acquired from other pro clubs during the summer.

Twenty-nine Raider veterans are expected to join the newcomers at camp Friday.
