### William C. Jones, UO dean, addresses Rotary

Dr. William C. Jones, Rotary governor for this area and dean of administration at the University of Oregon in Eugene, addressed Bend Rotarians Wednesday and linked them with more than a half million other business and professional men who belong to Rotary Clubs in communities around the world.

He said Rotary clubs are functioning in more than 11,500 communities in 129 countries, adding: "Despite the diversity of their languages, customs, and political and religious beliefs, they are working toward such mutually desired goals as community betterment, the promotion of high standards in business, and the advancement of world understanding."

Dr. Jones told the clubmen that their district has been "matched" with district 101 in Scotland, "as a means of furthering better understanding and friendlier relations between Rotarians of the two countries."

All Rotary districts have been similarly matched. Dr. Jones said, adding: "Our contacts with our 'sister' districts are taking shape through the possibility of an international golf tournament on the famous St. Andrews course."

Dr. Jones spoke of the new club for boys that is now a part of the Rotary program. Called "Interact", it is for boys in the upper three years of high school. "It is a club for international action," Dr. Jones said, and is designed to turn the attention of young men to service and international understanding.

### Rancher files motion to reduce amount in suit

PORTLAND (UPI)—Attorneys for Gold Hill rancher John Stewart Day filed motions in U.S. District Court here Wednesday asking that a total of more than \$3 million sought as damages by two Alaskan widows be reduced to a maximum of \$100,000.

The motions were made against complaints filed by Bettie M. Stevenson and Lavern Augusta Elliott. They are widows of two men, William Stevenson and Air Force T-Sgt. Robert Elliott Jr., who were killed when their light plane crashed on Mt. McKinley May 17, 1960, during a rescue operation.

The women have each asked for a total of \$1.7 million based on complaints of wrongful deaths. The two men were killed in an alleged attempt to rescue Day, who had broken his leg while climbing the mountain. They charged that Day was negligent in climbing the mountain thereby endangering his life and the lives of others.

### Fort Rock well levels studied

FORT ROCK — Bob DeBow, geologist from the office of the State Engineer, measured well depths in the Fort Rock-Christmas Lake basin early this week.

With wells pumping, it was expected that water levels would be down. DeBow reports, however, that the decrease since the April readings is only two to three tenths of a foot.

An effort is made to measure wells on the exact anniversary for a careful check at this time of year. This year he found, on a very widespread basis that wells are up two to five tenths of a foot from last year at this time.

These wells are part of the 700 wells measured throughout Oregon to tell the underground water story.
