

Homers, relief pitching keep Giants in race

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. (UPI) — The homerun ball plus strong pitching arms of Juan Marichal and reliever Bob Bolin, are keeping the San Francisco Giants within striking distance of the National League leaders, Los Angeles.

Marichal was going great guns until the ninth inning Thursday. He then faltered and Bolin came on to put down the Philadelphia Phillies and give the Giants a 4-3 decision.

What proved to be the deciding tally for the Giants was Willie McCovey's 24th home run off reliever Dallas Green in the eighth.

Marichal chalked up his 14th decision of the year and had a five-hitter with nine strikeouts going into the final frame. Tony Gonzalez greeted him with a triple and then Roy Sievers shot his fifth homer out of the park to bring the Phils within a run of the Giants.

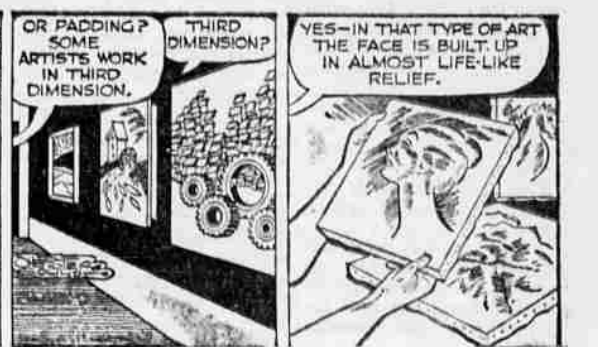

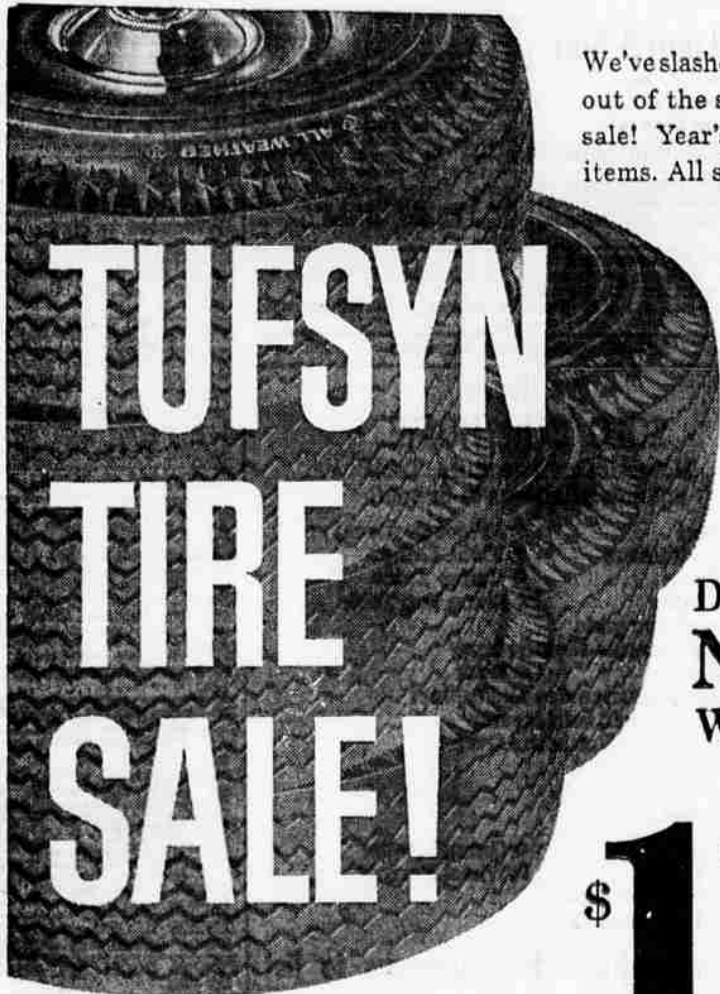
