

Abundant rains aid basin crops

FORT ROCK — Better than average hay yields and a lush grass and weed cover are results of abundant rains in the basin this season.

January through June precipitation totals for the area, as recorded at three weather stations, varies 7 of an inch. Moisture at the Lake station which was reactivated in April, 1962 totalled 6.40 during the first half of the current year. The station is on the Jack Gillette ranch, two miles east of Christmas Valley Lodge.

At The Poplars where Bud Parks has kept records for more than 25 years the rainfall for the period was 7.39 inches. This station is 16 miles from the Lake observation point.

Another 16 miles from The Poplars is the Fremont station, oldest of the three, where William Dehne recorded temperatures and rainfall for more than 40 years. His daughter, Mrs. Floyd Branch, recorded 7.10 inches for the six months period. Warmest temperature so far was noted on June 18 with 89 degrees at two of the stations and 90 at the third.

Ranchers in the area consider precipitation for the year's grass supply and dryland crops as beginning with the October rains. During the final quarter in 1962 rainfall at the three stations totalled 4.87, 5.81 and 6.17 inches in the order mentioned above.

PORTLAND (UPI) — Frank Rusher, who was born a Negro slave in Palestine, Tex., celebrated his 102 birthday here Saturday.

Rusher was born in 1860. He lives in Portland with his daughter, Mrs. Leona Pierce. Until about a year ago he made his home in Dallas, Tex.

"We had to get him up here so I could take care of him," Mrs. Pierce said. "You know how men are. They hatch and they don't eat right. He needs someone to see that he eats right."

Rusher agreed. "I've put on 90 pounds since I've been here," he said. He added that he weighed 125 pounds and was "kinda skinny" when he arrived in Portland.

Rusher received congratulations from Victor Christian, executive director of the Social Security Administration. The SA has his age at 100 because Rusher said the census records don't go back any farther.

PRESSES FOR REPORT

Tumalo Butte Lookout, Section 14, T. 17S, R. 11E, NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK O. HATFIELD, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of ORS 477.156, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above-described areas to be unlawful and that said areas shall be subject to entry only through permit to be issued by the forester or fire warden. Pursuant to ORS 477.158, the forester may during periods of fire hazard conditions, refuse, postpone or restrict issuance of such permits when necessary to prevent danger to life or property. The permit shall require the entrant:

- (1) To refrain from smoking except in places designated as safe in said permit.
(2) To build no open fires except in places designated as safe in said permit.
(3) To have as equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian or camping at improved, designated and posted campgrounds, tools specified by the forester as suitable for extinguishing fires.

This Proclamation shall be effective from and after the 17th day of July, 1963, and shall remain in full force and effect until terminated by similar order of the Governor.

Done at the Capital in Salem, Oregon, this 12th day of July, 1963.

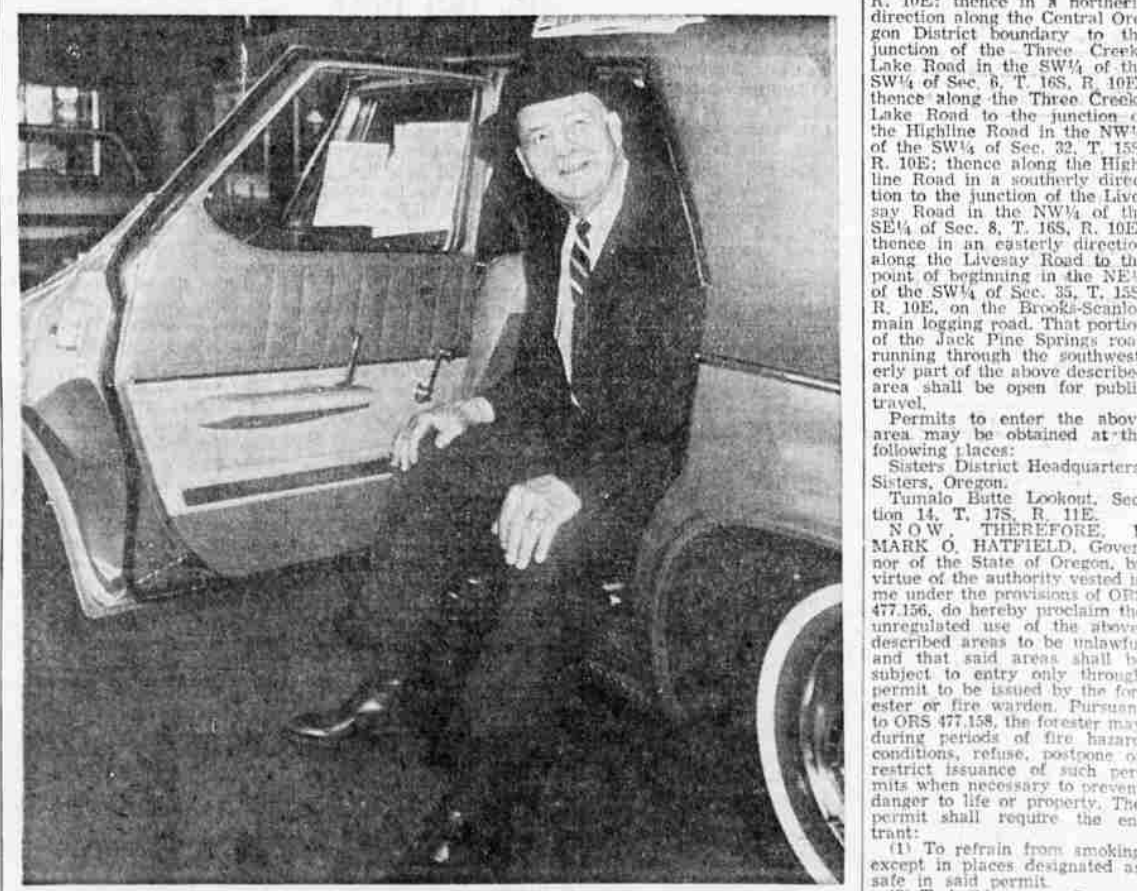
