Negligent homicide conviction of Baker man upheld by court

SALEM (UPI)—The Oregon Supreme Court today upheld the negligent homicide conviction of Charles Eugene Betts of Baker. A passenger in Betts' car was killed when it left the road and crashed. The decision upheld Baker County Circuit Judge Lyle R. Wolff.

By United Press International The Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union extended its strike against Georgia-Pacific Corp. today with the posting of pickets at Pilot Rock, Ore.

About 250 sawmill and logging employees were affected. The pickets appeared about 6 a.m. The Lumber and Sawmill Workers and the International Woodworkers of America (IWA) began closing down Georgia-Pacific operations last week in a contract dispute.

The pact, which must be ratified by union members at Simpson plants, calls for a wage increase amounting to 33 1/2 cents per hour during a three-year period.
