Ward admits he's 'thoroughly immoral man,' gives sordid details of sex, security scandal

LONDON (UPI)—Dr. Stephen Ward, admitting that he is a "thoroughly immoral man," testified today at his vice trial that he thoroughly disapproves of any woman who takes money "for sex alone."

Ward, whose introduction of day girl Christine Keeler to War Minister John Profumo opened the door to Britain's sex and security scandal, was called to the witness stand as the defense opened its case in Old Bailey court.

His attorney described him as a "highly sexed man who has had affairs with a great many women." Ward, osteopath, artist, and 3-year-old playboy, agreed that he was "thoroughly immoral."

He began his testimony shortly after Miss Keeler, 21-year-old red-haired call girl, testified for a second time and then ran the auntlet of a jeering, hooting crowd of more than 1,000 persons as she left the court. Two eggs were thrown at Christine, but they missed, and she was unhurt as police held back the crowd and hustled her away in a taxi.

Introduced To Profumo
Beginning his story of the scandal that threatened to topple the British government, Ward said he was introduced to Profumo by Viscount Astor, owner of the famed Cliveden estate where Ward maintained a cottage. The subsequent affair between

Record sales noted by firm

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Crowl Zellerbach Corp. reported record sales totaling \$290,079,000 in the first six months of the year, up four per cent over the same 1962 period.

Earnings, however, dipped by 11 percent to \$17,930,000, or \$1.14 per share, from \$18,040,000, or \$1.15 per share, in the same 1962 period, the company said.

The company blamed the decline in earnings on competitive conditions and a strike by lumber and logging unions early in June that shut down its lumber and plywood operations in Oregon and Washington.

Party planned for Jackie

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy will celebrate her 34th birthday Sunday at Cape Cod with a family party. Mrs. Kennedy's press secretary Pamela Turnure said Wednesday the gathering would be "more for the children" of the Kennedy clan and will be at the Cape Cod home the President has leased for the summer.

Miss Turnure said the First Lady plans to spend about three more weeks at Cape Cod and will return to Washington about Aug. 19. She has set a date to go to Walter Reed Army Hospital to undergo Caesarean section for the birth of her third child but the White House is keeping the date secret for the time being, Miss Turnure said.

The Air Force said Wednesday it spent about \$5,000 to fix up a hospital wing at Otis Air Force Base, Mass., after Mrs. Kennedy's doctors checked to see if a suite would be available for emergency use while Mrs. Kennedy is staying at Cape Cod.

King calls for special federal force to protect integrationists

Negro leader Martin Luther King Jr. has called for the creation of a special federal police force to protect integrationists.

King said after a "summit meeting" of Negro leaders in New York Wednesday that he would propose such a force to President Kennedy next month during a planned civil rights march in Washington.

King said a federal civil rights force is "seriously needed" to investigate complaints of local police brutality against integrationists. Such complaints currently are not acted upon, he said, because the government claims it lacks jurisdiction.

Around 265 persons, including a dozen whites, marched in front of the York, Pa., city hall Wednesday in a protest against segregation. There were no incidents during the two-hour demonstration.

The Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) said at New Orleans it would launch an intensive voter registration drive today in eight Louisiana parishes. At Baton Rouge, La., where Negroes

and police scuffled at a swimming pool Tuesday, authorities warned Wednesday they would move quickly to block any further rowdy desegregation demonstrations.

Renew Demonstrations

Racial demonstrations were renewed after a two-week lull in Gadsden, Ala., Wednesday and police arrested 8 of 150 Negroes picketing downtown lunch counters. Three Negroes were arrested at Birmingham, Ala., for trying to enter an all-white theater. Birmingham Tuesday repealed all of its segregation statutes.

A group of 111 Negroes marched in Charleston, S.C., Wednesday in protest of discriminatory practices in stores, but the demonstration, watched closely by police and state troopers, was orderly. Elsewhere in the nation:

Workers Return to Jobs

Cleveland, Ohio—Sixty craftsmen returned to their jobs at an underground construction site Wednesday after walking out Tuesday in a "misunderstanding" over the hiring of two non-union Negro plumbers.

Jackson, Miss.—Former Marine Byron de la Beckwith, accused

slayer of Negro leader Medgar Evers, was to be transferred today from jail to the state mental hospital for tests.

Oxford, Miss.—

The Army Wednesday pulled out the last of around 30,000 troops it sent last fall to force the admission of Negro student James H. Meredith into the University of Mississippi. Meredith said he would go on a speaking tour next month when he graduates from "Ole Miss."

New York—Jail sentences ranging from 30 to 60 days in the city workhouse were given Wednesday to five white men and women ar-

rested in the recent integration demonstrations at city construction sites.
