

Civil Defense agency to ask appropriation

SALEM (UPI) — The Oregon Civil Defense Agency will ask the State Emergency Board for \$46,110 next Friday.

At its meeting last week the agency's advisory council decided to seek enough money to hire three more employees.

Adding the three employees could make the state eligible for federal matching funds which would mean an additional six persons on the state staff.

The recent legislature slashed the Civil Defense staff from 18 to three and the federal government refused to provide any matching funds for employees.

The Civil Defense advisory council said that three more persons are needed if some county civil defense programs are to continue.

The request to the emergency board, which allocates money set aside by the legislature for emergency use, calls for \$43,170 for administrative expense of the agency and \$2,940 to acquire mobile equipment.

Also at the Friday meeting the state treasurer will ask \$35,650 to finance new duties brought on by the passage of the property tax deferral law.

The Department of Justice is seeking \$21,857 to pay for new duties added by the new uniform supervision of trustees for charitable purposes act.

The emergency fund now stands at \$2.2 million.

At its meeting the Emergency Board will also be asked to release money to the legislature for approved for construction of the Portland State College Science Building and the Eastern Oregon College Science - Mathematics Building.

The legislature required final plans for the buildings to be approved by the Emergency Board before the construction money is made available.

Morse seeking an explanation by Coast Guard

ASTORIA (UPI) — Senator Wayne Morse informed the Clatsop Central Labor Council Friday that he will demand a full explanation from the Coast Guard as to why it turned down Tongue Point Naval Station as a new location for its West Coast recruit training center.

The Coast Guard had decided against transferring the center from Alameda, Calif., because Tongue Point was too big and expensive to develop.

Walter Loggren, secretary of the Labor Council said he had asked the senator to investigate the reasons. He has also asked members of the Oregon congressional delegation to investigate reports that the Coast Guard would close the Point Adams lifeboat station at Hammond within the next two years.

Rep. Edith Green wrote the council and said the Point Adams closure has not been decided, although it was recommended by a long-range study group.

Ed Dealy will be the layman assisting with the service. A women's ensemble made up of members of the church choir will sing the anthem, "Pans Angelicus" by Franck. Mrs. C. E. Bush, church organist, will accompany them.

The Rev. James P. McGugin, pastor of the church, will be on vacation through August 24.

SALEM (UPI) — Oregon's National Guard Chief of Staff Brig. Gen. Gordon L. Doolittle, Camp Withycombe, has been picked by the Department of the Air Force to observe operations in Europe. Doolittle and eight other officers of the Air Force Reserve will leave Washington, D.C., Aug. 2 to visit major headquarters and Air Force bases in France, Germany and Great Britain.

The tour will also include one allied NATO base and a visit to Berlin.

Talks in angler break down controversy

VANCOUVER, B. C. (UPI) — Talks between the British Columbia Fisheries Association and the United Fishermen and Allied Workers' Union in Vancouver broke down Friday and a strike by 10,000 salmon fishermen, tendermen and shore workers continued.

Provincial Government Conciliation officer Reg Clements had indicated after an earlier meeting that he was "hopeful" of settlement. But late Friday there appeared no basis for agreement. Sources said the strike began July 13.

Salmon fishermen, tendermen and shore workers went on strike to back up demands for higher salmon prices. The B.C. Fisheries Association has since made a new settlement offer, but the union executive refused to allow a membership vote on it.

The Communist-led union, meanwhile, received a setback as a rebellion mounted with the union rank-and-file.

Capt. Steinar Antonsen, owner of a halibut boat, obtained supreme court injunction after the union refused his crew permission to make a trip to the fishing grounds when the strike began.

The union move tied up more than 50 halibut boats and threatened to idle the halibut fleet at a cost to workers and boat owners of \$1.5 million.

The court ruled Friday that the halibut fishermen were ordered to join the striking salmon fishermen without having a chance to approve or disapprove of strike action.

Morgan says he's undecided on candidacy

PORTLAND (UPI) — Outgoing Federal Power Commissioner Howard Morgan said Friday night that he has not decided if he will be a Democratic candidate for governor in 1966.

Morgan, former state party chairman who has been prominently mentioned as a candidate, made the statement at a news conference before a dinner speech to members of the West Side Democratic Club here.

"I'm not trying a dance of veils here," he said. "I have no firm plans."

"Personal and political problems must be resolved before I make a decision. I have two years."

But Morgan added "I'm not interested in any other office—I'm not interested in the U.S. Senate." Morgan, who also is former Oregon Public Utilities Commissioner, said he hoped to be through as a member of the FPC by Aug. 15.

He asked President Kennedy not to be disappointed by the nomination. He disagreed with its policies.

Morgan owns a ranch near Sisters.

NW's lumber tieup continues into 52nd day

PORTLAND (UPI) — Some 27,000 lumber workers remain idled today throughout the Northwest as the lumber dispute continued into its 52nd day.

Washington and Oregon Pope and Talbot, Inc., operations were struck Thursday and Friday by the International Woodworkers of America (IWA) and the Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union (LSW).

The union action followed a week in negotiations with the timber Operators Council, of which Pope and Talbot is a member. Talks with the group ended Thursday with union officials demanding a wage increase of 3 1/2 cents over a three-year period, and management offering a 26 cent hourly increase.

A TOC spokesman has quoted union officials as saying they will close all 196 members of the council, one-by-one if necessary, until the strike is settled. Another TOC member, the Edward Hines Lumber Co., had plants closed Thursday at Westfir and Dee, Ore.

The Friday strike against Pope and Talbot idled operations at Oakridge, St. Helens, Ore., and Kalama and Port Gamble, Wash.

The only future meeting scheduled between management and the striking unions, has been set for Monday at Portland. Scott Paper Co. officials will meet with representatives of the IWA and LSW to discuss terms of contracts which expired June 1.

Planned parenthood group plans Portland operation

SALEM (UPI) — A planned parenthood group which will distribute birth control information will go into operation in Portland Sept. 1. The State Public Welfare Commission was told Friday.

Rep. Grace Peck, D-Portland, said she had been informed of the plans of the new private program and wondered what the state commission's policy toward it would be.

Members of the commission took no stand on the question pending further information.

State Welfare Administrator Andrew Juras explained the commission would be faced with two policy decisions.

One would be what to do in case a welfare recipient asks for birth control services from the new organization and the other whether or not caseworkers should have the discretion to tell welfare recipients who haven't made any requests about the service.

Juras said that information regarding fees and the clinic's operation would have to be obtained before a policy could be recommended.

Commission member Cay Meyers, Portland, said the views of the public should be obtained before the commission makes a decision.

Intervention being sought

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Justice Department asked Friday to be allowed to step in to help the Western Pacific Railroad in a fight over use of a rail route through Camas, Wash.

In a brief filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission, the government said it sought to increase competition among railroads.

Western Pacific is seeking to force other railroads to make greater use of the so-called Baker route through Camas.

The route was established in 1931 by the ICC to provide competition to an older Southern Pacific route. However, Western Pacific has refused to publish rates which would allow shipments south to California through Portland, Ore., under the Beber route.
