## Bend Juniors drop 2 to Eugene squad

Baseball fans at the Municipal Ballpark Sunday got more than their money's worth, when the Bend Junior traveling team dropped both ends of a doubleheader against an active Eugene crew. What made it all worth watching, was when the locals went 11 innings before succumbing 3-2 in the opener.

Ron Wyatt, Bend's third-sacker turned hurler, tossed the whole distance for Bend. He gave up 13 hits.

Eugene won it in the top of the eleventh when centerfielder Burke

bombed a single to left, and then seconds later, took second on a fielder's choice. He was brought home for the winning tally when first-sacker Miller lined a single.

In Bend's half of that final frame, Wyatt took a base on balls and Dave Warrenburg rapped a single, advancing Wyatt to third. With two on and one down, it looked like Bend would come in with a tying or even the winning tally. It all came to a halt, when Rod Pitcher belted a fly ball to the second baseman who executed a double kill by "doubling-off" Warrenburg.

Klamath Falls took an 8-3 decision over Roseburg Sunday night to even that series after Roseburg won 2-1 Saturday.

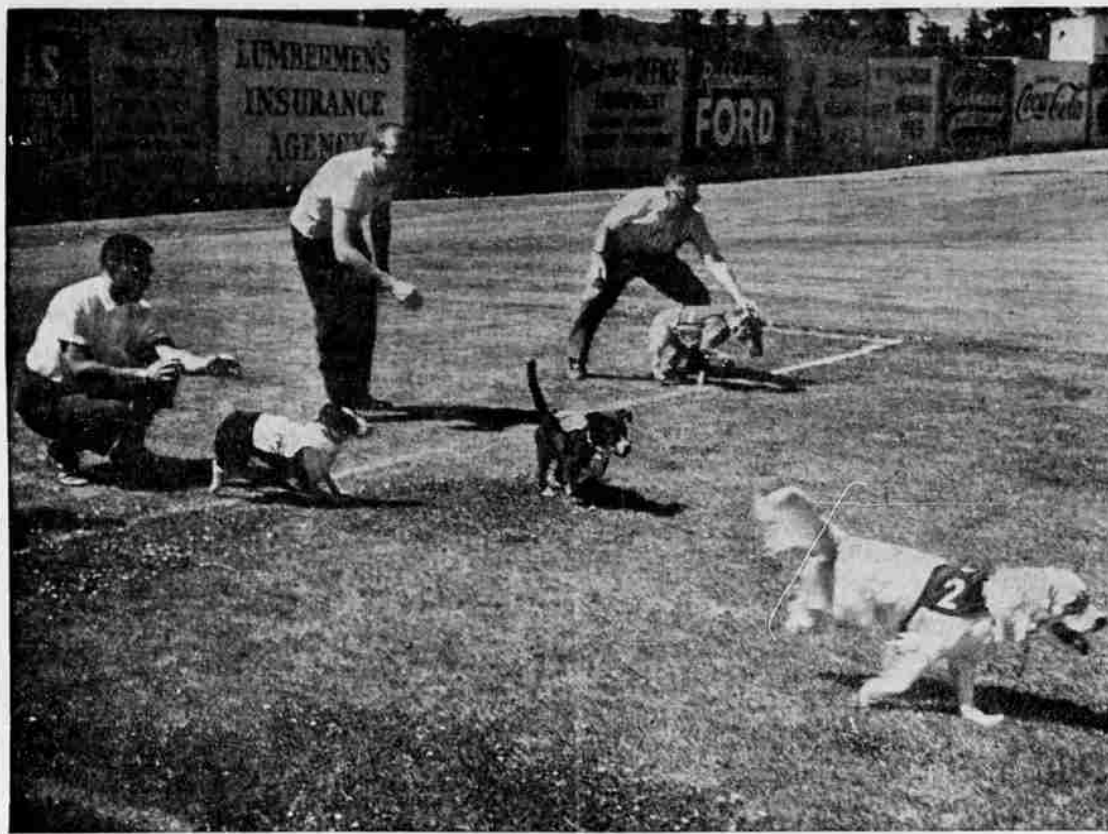
## The Dalles host

## No-pitch hurler Bo Belinsky gets more 'headlines'

Bo Belinsky, who has not pitched a baseball for about six weeks but has done right well in the headlines because of his off-again, on-again romance with Mamie Van Doren, may be wondering whether it was worth it all to return to the baseball diamond.

He started the season with the Los Angeles Angels but after a poor showing, was ordered to report to Hawaii of the Pacific Coast League. Belinsky balked at the transfer but a week ago he had a change of heart and reported for duty with the Islanders.

He made his first appearance on the mound at Tacoma Sunday and the baptism to PCL bats was not a happy one for the gaby-Bo. Don Gile and Bill Haine each tagged Belinsky for two run homers and then Ricardo Joseph added a solo homer for a total of five runs. Belinsky retired the side in the eighth. The Giants won the game 16-6 and then took the nightcap in eight innings, 4-3.

### Other Action

In other games Sunday Oklahoma City and Seattle split, the 80ers winning the other 2-0 but dropping the nightcap 3-1.

San Diego downed Dallas-Ft. Worth in the opener 5-2 but lost the second, 1-0; Salt Lake City and Denver exchanged slugfests, the Bees winning the first 18-5 and the Bears the second 14-8; and Spokane took its single game from Portland 3-2.

John Goetz was credited with the first game win, coming in to relieve Jim Constable in the sixth. He contributed a home run with two mates aboard in the sixth to aid his own cause.

The Thomas boys got together in the nightcap with Jerry of Tacoma besting Ed of Hawaii in a well-pitched contest for both men as they gave up eight hits each. The game was scheduled for seven innings but went on extra in which the Giants tallied the deciding marker on Paul Smith's double.

### Gile Clouts

Don Gile wielded the big bat for Tacoma in both games, homering in each, the second a 390 foot blast.

Two runs in the seventh and last inning gave Jerry Nelson a 2-0 victory over Seattle in the first game. He tossed a two-hitter. In the nightcap Bill Tuttle won the game for the Rainiers with a two-run homer in the fifth after Seattle had scored earlier in the inning. Guido Grilli got the win in relief and Billy Macleod the loss.

Dallas-Ft. Worth broke even with San Diego and thus clung to its one-half game lead over Oklahoma City. Bobby Klaus slammed a home run in the seventh with two aboard to cinch the first contest. Joe Bonikowski and Jim Rantz combined efforts in tossing a three-hitter to best the Padres 1-0. Scott Breeden, who also allowed three hits, was the loser.

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## Matchmaker seeking Clay, Jones on Terrell card

NEW YORK (UPI)—Matchmaker Teddy Brenner today sought high-ranked Cassius Clay or Doug Jones as the next opponent for Ernie Terrell, Chicago giant and new scourge of the heavyweight division.

Brenner was so impressed by 24-year-old Terrell's lopsided, nationally televised victory over contender Zora Folley at Madison Square Garden, Saturday night, he declared today:

"Terrell is potentially the greatest fighter in the heavyweight division. Six months from now he will be able to whip champion Sonny Liston because of his height, reach, speed, strength and ruggedness."

Big Ernie's lopsided decision over veteran Folley of Chandler, Ariz., was his eighth straight victory. In his latest previous bout

on April 13, Terrell had outpointed contender Cleveland Williams of Houston, Tex.

"Now," said Brenner, "I want Terrell to fight Clay or Jones on Sept. 30 or Oct. 18. I'm offering Clay a minimum guarantee of \$35,000 with the privilege of 30 per cent of all net proceeds. And I'm offering Jones a guarantee of \$19,000."

Brenner stressed that a Liston-Clay match in September was unlikely because Clay's handlers want him to have a couple more bouts before challenging big Sonny.

Terrell, who carries 204 pounds on a six-foot-seven frame, was rated eighth among contenders when he went into the ring against seventh-ranked Folley, 203½. And the betting was at "even money."

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## WINS AND LOSES

VILLARS, Switzerland (UPI)—Fred Stolle of Australia, runner-up at the Wimbledon tournament, won the men's singles final of the Villars International tennis tournament Sunday although he

dropped two other titles. After disposing of countryman Bob Hewitt, 6-4, 6-3, in the singles final, Stolle combined with Hewitt to lose the men's doubles and then lost the mixed doubles title with his sister Patricia Stolle.

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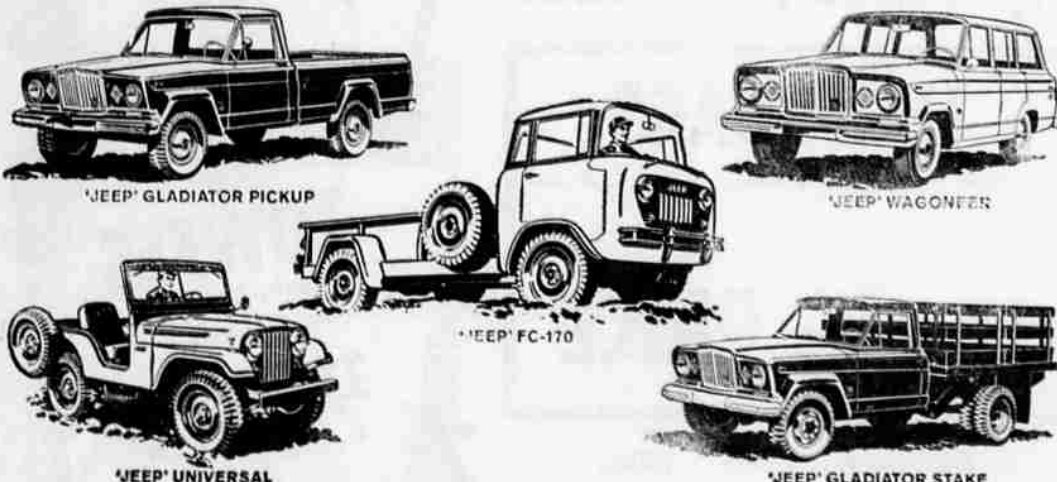
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
