Peach of idea concerns pears

Canned pears make good companions for meat and poultry when they're prepared with herbs or spices.

With lamb, serve minted pears, tinted green with vegetable coloring and flavored with mint extract or fresh mint leaves.

Add horseradish to pear syrup, heat and pour over pears to serve with beef.

Fill center of pears with cranberry sauce to accompany pork.

Sprinkle the pear halves with curry to serve with chicken.

Add candied or powdered ginger to the fruit to go with veal.

Spread pears with prepared or powdered mustard, brown sugar and lemon juice, to serve with ham or pork.

Hatfield urges cooperation in state-wide pest control

SALEM (UPI)—Close cooperation between Oregon's natural resource agencies in research on the effect of chemicals used to control pests was called for by Gov. Mark Hatfield Monday.

Hatfield's comments came as the Committee on Natural Resources heard reports on studies by Oregon State University, the State Board of Health and State Department of Agriculture on the

effect of pesticides.

Hatfield said each state agency shouldn't just be carrying on its own research projects but should share all known information with every agency.

Dr. Virgil Freed, head of the agriculture chemical department at Oregon State University, said no real buildup of chemicals has been found in the state's subsoils as a result of spraying.
