Taylor slow, Hornung out

Packers weaker for college all-stars

The defensive unit of the College All-Stars should enjoy Saturday morning a good deal more than their predecessors of last year.

That's the day after the rookie pros test the rugged Green Bay Packers in the mid-summer classic. Last year the collegians spent most of the evening trying to restrain the hardest running backfield in the country, and the greater part of the next day nursing their aches and pains.

But this year Paul Hornung has been deleted from the Packer cast as the result of an indefinite suspension, and bruising fullback Jim Taylor is not running up to his usual standard.

Taylor, who suffered a strained knee ligament last Saturday, proved that the injury still bothers him in Tuesday's workout, and is expected to see only part time action against the All-Stars Friday night. Linebacker Ray Nitschke, another doubtful starter, still was in the hospital for a back injury he sustained last Thursday.

The rest of the Packers, however, remain hale and hearty, which usually is enough to intimidate an opponent.

The Minnesota Vikings did "lots of running" and worked on play execution in preparation for a controlled scrimmage game Saturday night, while Bill McPeak of the Washington Redskins took special notice of his rookies as the "Skins concentrated on fundamental drills. Of particular satisfaction to McPeak was the work of Jim Turner and Randy Hutto.

The Baltimore Colts found rookie fullback Roy Walker back on their doorstep Tuesday after the former Purdue star had gone "AWOL" last Thursday. Walker, who went home without an explanation, gave no reason for his actions. Although coach Don Shula planned disciplinary action against him, Walker was expected to resume practice today.

The Detroit Lions were still experiencing personnel problems. Defensive halfback Dick (Night Train) Lane and Dick LaBeau

signed their 1963 contracts, but four veterans, including All-Pro linebacker Joe Schmidt, still are holding out.

The Cleveland Browns spent most of their practice session executing and handling the blitz, and various methods of rushing the passer. Coach Blanton Collier indicated he was particularly satisfied with the blocking of the offensive backfield.

Meanwhile over in the American Football League, the Buffalo Bills, darkhorse contenders for

Eastern Division honors, spent a long time on their aerial game with quarterbacks Jackie Kemp and Daryle Lamonica displaying excellent precision.

The Denver Broncos, preparing for their first exhibition game of the year with the Houston Oilers on Saturday night, acquired Bill Miller, a 6-foot-5, 262-pound guard, from the Oilers for a 1964 draft choice. The Broncos also released rookies Ken Blair, Jim D'Alesio, and Jim Hillis.

U.S. tracksters (men) favorites over Germans

HANNOVER, Germany (UPI)—The U.S. men's track and field team, led by world champion pole vaulter John Pennel, was a prohibitive favorite to beat a West German team today and alone for a crushing defeat suffered by the U.S. women's team.

Payton Jordan, coach of the U.S. men's team shuffled his lineup considerably for the two-day meet which will start today at Hiedersachsen Stadium.

Jordan was hoping the change of assignments would help the U.S. men's team score the same kind of victory over West Germany that it did against Russia and Poland.

West Germany's women's track and field team routed the U.S. women's team, 71-45, Tuesday at nearby Braunschweig.

Jutta Heine, who captivated American indoor track fans in the U.S. last winter, led West Germany by scoring victories in the 200 meter dash and in the 400-meter relay where she came from behind to win on the anchor leg.

Prior to those performances, however, Miss Heine suffered a surprise defeat in the 100 yard dash at the hands of America's Edith McGuire. Miss McGuire's victory was one of only three by the U.S. in 11 events.

Besides Miss McGuire, the only other U.S. women winners were Willye White of Chicago, who won the broad jump with a leap of 29 feet, 9 1/2 inches, and Eleanor Montgomery of Cleveland, whose leap of 5 feet, 7 1/2 inches won the high jump event.
