Top tossing, hitting produce Spokane wins

The Spokane Indians keep winning because of outstanding pitching and timely hitting. They keep winning despite the fact that the parent Los Angeles Dodgers have speared several Indian stars for duty in the majors.

The team completed an almost unbelievable July home stand Wednesday, winning 19 games and losing but two. The Indians downed Oklahoma City 5-4 last night.

The winningest pitcher in the Pacific Coast League, Howie Reed (13-5) was rapped out of the box by the 89ers but that didn't stop the Indians. Reliever Mel McGavock picked up the streak to gain his fifth decision.

Spokane trailed early in the game, 3-0. But they counted two in the fifth and two in the sixth and scored the stay-ahead run in the sixth on a walk and back-to-back doubles by Mike Brumley and Bart Shirley. It was the seventh straight win for Spokane and ninth straight at home.

In other games Dallas-Ft. Worth whipped Denver 10-7; Portland edged Tacoma 3-2 in 11 innings; San Diego bested Salt Lake City 2-1 and Hawaii downed Seattle 4-1.

Relief artist Jim Handrahan of Portland bounced a single in the 11th inning to score Bill Kern with the winning run against Tacoma. Handrahan gained the victory, too, although he pitched only one-third of an inning.

Tacoma tallied twice in the fifth on an error and hits by Don Gile and Gil Carrido. The Beavers didn't score until the ninth but then punched across two runs in a fielder's choice and a wild pitch after the bases were loaded. That sent the contest into overtime. Wayne Schurr, the fourth Giant hurler, took the loss.

The reversal for Tacoma plus Spokane's victory put the Indians 8 1/2 games in the lead in the Northern Division and Oklahoma City's loss to Spokane dropped the 89ers 2 1/2 games back of Dallas-Ft. Worth in the Southern Division.

Hawaii's Mike Lee turned in a fine pitching performance as the Islanders downed Seattle. He twirled seven innings of perfect ball and gave up a total of only two hits.

The first hit came in the eighth when leadoff man Stan Johnson banged a ground rule double and scored on a single by Chico Fernandez. Until that time Lee had retired 21 consecutive batters.

Bob Perry had a triple, double and a single to lead the Hawaii attack.

Lee now has a record of 1-1 while loser Larry Foster now has a 4-4 mark.

Ted Sadowski allowed only one hit in the last six innings as Dallas-Ft. Worth breezed to a 10-4 triumph over Denver. He helped his own cause with a three run triple in the fifth stanza and broke the 4-4 tie. It was Sadowski's ninth win against 8 losses. Pedro Olivo had a homer with two on in the third and Joe Christian had a solo in the same inning for the rangers.

Sammy Ellis put the stopper on San Diego's loss string to Salt Lake City when he tossed a no-hit four hitter and a 2-1 victory. It was the first victory over the Bees in the teams' last 11 games.

Weekend fishing on both sides of the Cascades look good

Weekend fishing prospects look extremely good today, a report from the Central Oregon regional office of the Oregon State Game Commission said today.

By districts and in brief, the fishing picture is as follows.

Bend District — Angling for kokanee continues to produce good catches at Elk Lake. Best results are obtained by bait anglers using worm worms. At Three Creeks Lake, trolling with spinner and worm is producing good catches of rainbow. Evening fly fishing has also provided good catches of rainbow. At Paulina Lake, trolling and still fishing are providing very good catches of rainbow. During the evening, fly fishermen are taking good catches of rainbow. Angling continues to be good with several large rainbow being taken from the Crane Prairie Reservoir.

At East Lake, trollers are taking fair catches of rainbow. Excellent catches of large rainbow and Atlantic salmon are being taken by a few anglers at Davis Lake. Trolling during early morning has provided the better catches. At Blue Lake, lures and bait are producing nice catches of rainbow. Good catches of kokanee are being taken at Suttle Lake. At Fall River, early morning and late evening angling with flies and bait are producing nice catches of rainbow and brook trout. Good catches of rainbow are being taken by fly fishermen at Metolius River.

Upper Willamette District — The McKenzie and upper Willamette Rivers are low and clear with good catches being made late in the day. Upper tributary streams are producing good catches of small cutthroat on flies. Hills Creek Reservoir is good on Hills Creek or Willamette River arms. Clear Lake and other Cascade lakes have been fair.

Second place finishers in each class met for another race-off and third place honors. Randy Cantrell was the Class B runnerup, and Tom Busche was the Class A pusher. The race-off saw Tom Busche take the measure of Randy Cantrell.

Pedro Ramos fans 15 Angels, belts 2 homers

Cleveland right-hander Pedro Ramos struck out 15 Los Angeles batters Wednesday and socked two home runs in a 9-5 nightcap victory. The Indians won the opener from the Angels, 1-0.

Ramos hit his first homer in the third inning off loser Eli Grba and connected again in the sixth when the Indians tied the major league record by belting four consecutive homers of shell-shocked Paul Foytack.

Woody Held launched the barrage and Ramos, Tito Francona and Larry Brown followed with back-to-back blows that tied the mark set by Milwaukee's Ed Matthews, Hank Aaron, Joe Adcock and Frank Thomas on June 10, 1961.

Ramos went 8 1/3 innings Wednesday night before Gary Bell came on to preserve his fifth victory.

Whitfield Grand Slammed

Pedro was nicked for 11 hits and Leon Wagner, but the Indians hit six. Fred Whitfield connected for a grand slam in the third inning and his sixth inning homer in the opener broke open a scoreless duel between Barry Latman and Fred Newman.

Jim Landis and Camilo Carrero collected three hits apiece for the White Sox as Ray Herbert gained his 10th victory by holding the Senators to seven hits in eight innings. Hoyt Wilhelm finished up. Don Zimmerman homered for Washington.

Southpaw Steve Barber outduelled Frank Lary in Baltimore's victory over Detroit. Al Smith singled home the winning run in the first inning to hand Lary his fifth setback in six decisions. Barber, whose record now is 14-8, allowed six hits and the only run off him was unearned.

The Twins bombed the Red Sox' prize relievers, Jack Lamabe and Dick Radatz, for five runs in the seventh inning to break a 4-all tie.

There were 10 races (heats) and trophies were awarded each victor. Additional trophies were awarded the five hounds that emerged placers in the finals.

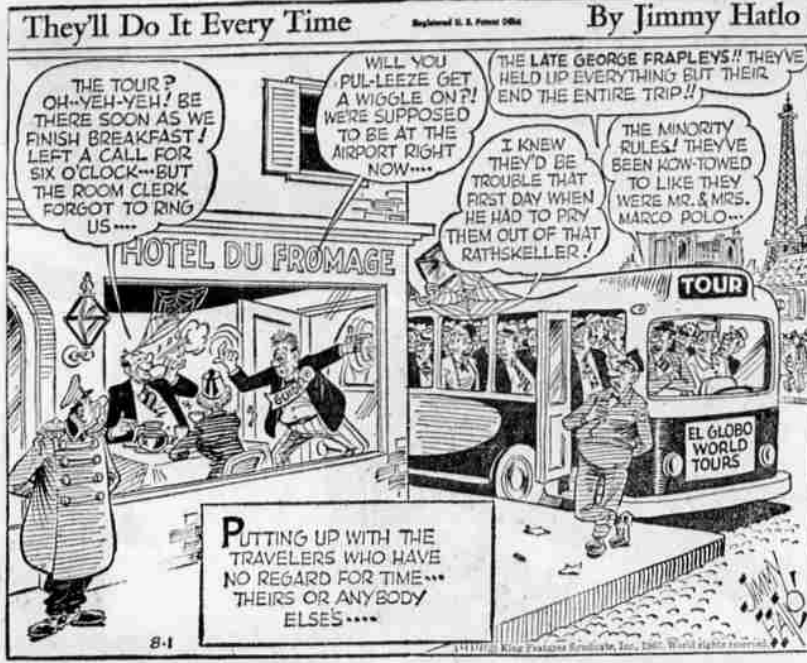
