Roundup gets 3-bout mat card in extra billing

PRINEVILLE — One of the feature events of the Crooked River Roundup will be the wrestling program on Saturday, August 10, at the Roundup grounds. Starting time for the first event will be 8 p.m.
Billy White Wolf, outstanding American Indian wrestler, will defend his Northwest heavyweight belt against his challenger, Soldat Gorky, one-time Russian wolf hunter and all around bad man.
White Wolf won his belt, emblematic of supremacy in the northwest area, by defeating Mad-dog Maurice Vashon who had previously lifted the buckle from Luther Lindsey. Official representatives will accept the belt from White Wolf and hold it during the match and will then turn it over to the referee who will award it to the winner.
The referee will be Pogo Pogo, fabulous Samoan who sometimes does the sword dance along with his officiating.

Shag Thomas, one time Green Bay Packer and wrestling and football star at Ohio State in his undergar days, will be on the program. He will take on Pretty Pat Patterson, who was born in Paris, raised in Montreal and makes Boston his headquarters.
Patterson has a weakness for pretty buttons and bows, but there his weakness stops. He is labeled a tartar in the ring.
The Thomas - Patterson clash will be the semifinal of the three bout card which will be open air, under the stars, in front of the grandstand.
Opening the program, Wild Bill Savage, Joliet jolter, will take on Abe Jacobs who holds the heavy-weight title of Australia and New Zealand. Jacobs comes from Wellington, the same town from which Pat O'Connor came. The New Zealander has what he calls his "kiwi roll" for a favored hold.
The Prineville Jaycees are sponsoring wrestling for the Roundup and Harry Elliott, Seattle promoter, will assist the group and be promoter under Jaycee direction.
Tickets are already on sale at Prineville Men's Wear, Healy's Bend Furniture store in Bend. Healy's Redmond Furniture store in Redmond and We's Department store in Madras.
The doors open at 7 with the first event firing off at 8 p.m.

Rarin' Roundup starts at 7:30

PRINEVILLE — A buckin', rarin' rodeo show will come out of the chutes at the Crooked River Roundup grounds tonight, as the 18th annual roundup in Prineville gets underway with a night show slated to start in a bunting-draped arena at 7:30 p.m.
The two daytime shows Saturday and Sunday are scheduled to see the flag go up on the pole over the announcer's stand at 1:15. All three shows will begin with an elaborate but fast-paced grand entry, and the competition will begin with a whirlwind mad scramble of bucking horses from all chutes.

Only local entries will be on the hurricane decks for the mad scramble. Immediately afterwards, the show gets underway, with some 140 professional rodeo riders and ropers competing for top money.
Cowboys will pit their skill against stock furnished by Christiansen Brothers, Eugene, in six major events, including saddle bronc, bareback and bull riding, team and calf roping and steer wrestling. Races will be added on the rodeo programs for the day-time shows, including the fast quarterhorse race, a girls' barrel race and a cowhide race.

Although a number of good seats are left for the three performances, Roscoe Hopper, ticket sales chairman, states that advance sales are considerably ahead of last year. Much larger crowds are expected than in recent years, with board members giving much credit for this to the half-price promotion some time ago and to the enthusiasm shown during Crook-O-Doo days.

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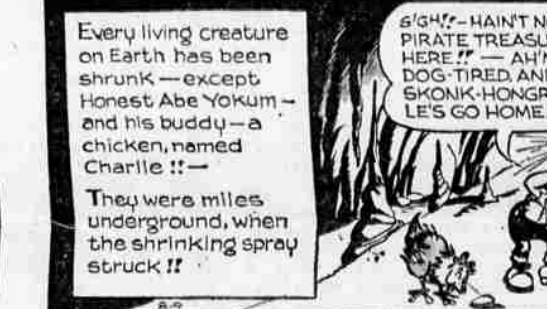
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
