## County schools to open Sept. 3

Deschutes County schools, with the exception of Bend public schools, will open on September 3. Bend schools will begin September 9.

There will be eight new teachers in the Redmond school system. Mrs. Robert Sterling and Paul Aiken will be new on the John Tuck School staff. Mrs. Sterling will teach sixth graders while Aiken will be teaching the seventh grade.

At Redmond Union High School, new teachers will be Kenneth Bjorklund who will teach business education; Weldon Lewis, social studies; and Barbara Jean Murphy, English.

Other new teachers at the high school will be Tom Sander, teaching art, Allen Uematsu whose field is general mathematics, and Carolyn Witty who will teach girls physical education and health.

Miss Pam Wyatt will be new to the staff of Tumalo elementary school. The June graduate of Oregon College of Education will teach the first grade. There will be a new teacher at Terrebonne, Mrs. Fern Braly. She will teach the seventh grade. Mrs. George Burkart of Bend will be teaching at Cloverdale.

Sisters public schools will have four new staff members. Mrs. Robert Morss will be teaching fourth graders. Teaching the eighth grade will be Ted Reinwald. He is a 1963 graduate of Oregon State University.

Also new will be Miss Marcia Hedges who will teach girls physical education. Jack Linn will be the new English teacher at the high school.

Alfalfa and Brothers elementary schools will have the same teachers that were there last year.

## First day of school will see 28 new Bend teachers

Twenty-eight new teachers will man their desks in the Bend public schools on opening day, September 9.

There will be five new teachers at the senior high school. Teaching mathematics will be Ernest Davidson. He has a bachelor's degree from Pacific University and four years teaching experience at Pilot Rock.

## Schools may get record enrollment

Figures showing a record enrollment in Bend public schools are expected to show themselves during registration.

Elementary schoolers will register in their respective school on September 5 from nine in the morning until noon. Junior and senior high school registration will be September 5 and 6. Definite times for registering will not be known until later in August.

An estimated 3736 elementary, junior and senior high school students are expected to crowd through the doors on opening day, September 9.

A breakdown of enrollment estimates puts 1893 youngsters in the nine elementary schools, 937 at Bend Junior High School, and 908 at the senior high.

The senior high school, which was over-crowded last year with 765 students, will have 908 expected students jamming the halls. The building, completed in 1955 has a capacity of 600.

Last year's total enrollment was 3557. There were 877 students enrolled at Bend Junior High and 1883 in elementary grades.

## New Bear Creek school to open

Expectations are high about the opening of the Bear Creek elementary school and the new addition of the Bend Senior High School.

The elementary school, with grades one through six, should be open by opening day, September 5, or soon thereafter, according to R. E. Jewell, superintendent of public schools.

The new school, located on 13th Street and Bear Creek Road, has eight rooms and will accommodate an estimated 240 students. Construction began March 19.

If the school is not completed by the opening days of school, there will be a double shift run at Allen School. This would be the only place with a double shifting in the Bend public schools.

The new addition to the senior high school will not be finished for the beginning of school, but is hoped to be in use by the first of November.

Until construction is completed, classes will be held again in the gymnasium, auditorium, possibly in the Presbyterian Church, and wherever else room can be found.

The present senior high school building, first used in 1955, has a capacity of 600. Over 700 students and teachers faced crowded conditions last year. Estimated enrollment for the 1963-64 school year is 908.

The new addition includes an expansion of the library, language and physics laboratories, and an industrial arts building. Last year the industrial arts classes were held in the junior high building.

There will also be a classroom section of 11 rooms and a large lecture room which will relieve the crowded conditions.

## New principal getting ready for school start

Ray Talbert will assume official duties as principal of Bend Senior High School on the opening day of school, September 9.

Prior to moving to Bend, Talbert was principal at Douglas High School in Winston, near Roseburg. He has also been principal at Glendale High School and has taught science in Hillsboro.

The native Oregonian is a graduate of Albany High School and Oregon State University.

The Talbert family, living at 1207 E. 10th Street, includes Talbert, his wife, Carol, and their four children, Nicole, 13, Ronald, 10, Maria, 8, and Gary, 4.
