

Many activities pack schedule for annual Jefferson County Fair

MADRAS — The annual fair parade, a halter class horse show, rodeo action and varied other events await Jefferson County Fair goers the final two days of the fair Saturday and Sunday, August 24 and 25.

Fair activities opened Tuesday with the annual style review and varied 4-H and FFA contests occupied the fair activities building up to the weekend festivities.

Opening Saturday will be the annual downtown parade with seven divisions and featured children's entries, horseback groups, Indians in regalia and floats and other entries from varied organizations and commercial firms.

At noon in the main fair grounds arena a cutting horse contest sponsored by the Central Oregon Cutting Horse Association is presented.

Rough tough stock and eager competitors going after over \$300 in guaranteed prize money plus entry fees will be featured in the first performances of the rodeo scheduled for 1 p.m. Saturday with the program set again on Sunday at 1 p.m. A half dozen rodeo events and five races are planned for each day's program.

Son Baines, Madras, will furnish stock for the rodeo. Scheduled are saddle and bareback bronc riding, calf roping, bulldogging, team roping and bull riding. Races scheduled for each day include a 1/2 mile race, a 1/4 mile race, barrel races, a relay race and the ever popular chariot races.

Queen Parline Norton and princesses Jennie Campbell and Dayle Steel will rule over all fair and rodeo events.

An added feature both Saturday and Sunday will be the Albany Scottish Bagpipe Band. The Pipers will appear in concert at 6:30 p.m. Saturday prior to the annual 4-H and FFA Market Animal Sale at 7:30 p.m.

Rose Maddox will be featured at a fair time show and dance at 9 p.m. on both Friday and Saturday.

Sunday's program will get underway at 8 a.m. with a pancake breakfast to be served until 10 a.m.

Madras saddle club will sponsor a Halter Class Horse Show with trophies awarded the best entries in Appaloosa, Arabian quarter horse, Tennessee Walker and unregistered light breeds division. The halter class show will get underway at 7:30 a.m. and conclude about noon to be followed by the final performance of the rodeo.

Throughout the fair the best of Jefferson County's produce and 4-H projects will be on display.
