## Spokesman for plywood firm scores union

**ANDERSON, Calif. (UPI)** — A spokesman for the United States Plywood Corp., struck since June 4, has charged the striking union "wants to have its cake and eat it too."

Frank Doherty, a company representative, said the company would not discuss local disagreements with Local 2508, Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union.

All questions from the local, which represents 600 men, have been referred to attorneys of the "Big Six" operators, which reached agreement with the parent union in Portland, Ore., recently, he said. He said this agreement precluded any bargaining on local issues.

"The Redding local, by piecemeal acceptance of a settlement, apparently intends to gain the benefits of association bargaining, while at the same time rejecting its obligations. It wants to have its cake and eat it too."

Henry Anderson, LSW business agent, said the company was backing down on agreements made last March to bargain on local issues.

The plant here is the only major mill still strikebound as a result of the Northwest lumber industry labor dispute.

## Four salvage sales reported

**PRINEVILLE** — The results of four timber salvage sales by the Ochoco National Forest have been reported by C. L. Clark, forest supervisor.

Hudspeth Pine submitted the sole oral auction bid of \$203,457 for some 14,500,000 board feet of timber in the Lemon Creek sale area on the Prineville ranger district, Clark said. The bid was \$100 above the minimum acceptable bid. Both Hudspeth and Pine Products submitted sealed bids at the minimum price.

High oral bid of \$6,545 for 650,000 board feet of timber in the Crazy Creek salvage sale was submitted by Consolidated Pine. This was \$107.50 above the minimum acceptable price posted by the Ochoco forest office. Four oral bids were made at the auction.

Single bids were received at two small auction sales. Pine Products submitted the bid of \$14.95 a thousand for 130,000 board feet of pine and \$8.70 for 20,000 board feet of fir and other species in the McKay Creek area. Ochoco Lumber company was the sole bidder on the Cadle Creek salvage sale of some 150,000 board feet of pine. Bid price, the same as the advertised price, was \$12.65 per thousand board feet.

## Brand Cafe theft probed

Sheriff's officers are investigating a burglary at Bob Blair's new Brand Cafe, on U.S. Highway 97, south of Redmond. About \$8 in cash was taken.

The cash register was forced open, and the contents were removed, according to Sheriff Forrest Sholes. The burglary occurred sometime after closing hours Tuesday, and the loss was reported yesterday.

There was no sign of forced entry. Officers said that the burglar apparently entered through a door inadvertently left unlocked. Only the cash register was disturbed.

## Evans may fight against extradition

**PORTLAND (UPI)** — Robert J. Evans, 27, of Honolulu, may fight extradition to Oregon from Fremont, Neb., to face charges of first degree murder in the strangulation death of Irene Davis, police said today.

Detectives told the Oregon Journal today that Evans has refused to agree on a waiver of extradition to Oregon until he consults an attorney.

If he refuses, it could take 30 days to complete the proceedings and return him for trial. The 41-year-old Fayette, Idaho, cattle heiress was found in a bathtub at the Portland Hilton hotel Aug. 6. A nylon stocking had been wound around her neck and she was clad only in a black half slip.

Officers said a search of Evans' car at Fremont has turned up about \$1,000 in cash and a ring similar to one which belonged to Mrs. Davis.
