Triplett reaches end of grid career

Met Triplett, a veteran of eight National Football League seasons and once one of the game's best ground-gainers, apparently has reached the end of his professional career.

Only the fifth draft choice of the New York Giants in 1955, Triplett went on to become the fifth leading rusher in team history before he was traded to the Minnesota Vikings in 1961. Earlier this year he was traded from the Vikings to the Cleveland Browns.

It was the Browns who dropped the final axe on the aggressive, 31-year-old fullback, handing him

his release Wednesday only two days before the squad was due to leave for a series of West Coast exhibition games.

Released along with Triplett were Jim Bebbitt, George Thomas, Don Mullins, Stan Szurek, Bob Butts and Walter Beach, thereby reducing the Cleveland roster to 44 players.

In other National League camps: Buddy Parker gave his defensive backfield an extensive workout in preparation for Pittsburgh's game with the Baltimore Colts on Saturday... rookie quarterback Gkynn Griffing worked out in the defensive backfield for the Giants although he

The San Francisco Forty Niners concentrated on their offense in preparing for Sunday's meeting with Cleveland.

To face Hawaii

Spokane may wrap up PCL title this week

The Spokane Indians could virtually wrap up the Pacific Coast League championship this week. The Indians are en route to Hawaii where they meet the second-place Islanders in a four game series starting Friday.

Spokane, which has led the circuit during most of the second half of the season, currently is 12 games in front as they move to Hawaii.

Loop President Dewey Soriano announced that a flip of a coin will decide where the opening game of the playoff will be held. He said the coin-flipping would take place at Seattle Sunday.

Oklahoma City and Dallas-Ft. Worth currently are battling for top spot in the Southern Division with San Diego snapping at their heels.

In games Wednesday night Larry Foster of Seattle pitched a one-hitter to beat Portland 1-0; Salt Lake City downed Dallas-Ft. Worth 8-4; Denver took Oklahoma City 4-3 in the first game but the 89er's took the second tilt, 5-1; San Diego whipped Spokane 8-2, and in Hawaii 3,225 fans watched the Islanders make it five straight over Tacoma 5-1 and 11 consecutive victories.

Jim Hughes doubled off Foster in the fifth inning for the lone Beaver hit at Portland. A crowd of only 193 persons was on hand for the pitcher's battle. Foster struck out 12 and walked two. Foster and Stan Johnson were the batting stars with two hits each.

Seattle's only run came in the fourth when Johnson singled, went to second on a wild pitch and scored on Chico Fernandez' single.

Denver, scoring all its runs in the last inning, took this first game of its twin bill with Oklahoma City 4-3. Chi Chi Olivo chalked up his 11th victory giving up seven hits.

The big seventh frame saw Chico Salmon triple, Ethan Blackaby and Phil Roof drew walks and Tom Borland replaced starter Jim Glendon on the mound. Pinch hitter Bob Uecker took first on an interference call against the 89er catcher, Salmon being waved across the plate. Two more runs scored on a throwing error and then Tommy Aaron drove in the winning tally with a single.

In the nightcap Russ Kemmerer, for the last few years a relief artist, switched to starter and went the distance scattering six hits. Five runs in the fifth were enough margin for the 89er victory with George Williams providing a three run triple.

Gordy Seyfried kept 10 hits scattered to gain his 11th win against 12 losses as Salt Lake City pounded four Range pitchers for 14 hits. Billy Cowan and Jesse White led the assault with four hits each. Cowan getting his 21st home run of the year.

Jim Owens clipped Spokane with a neat five-hitter and his second complete game. The win gave San Diego the series, two games to one. It marked the first time this year the Indians have lost a series at home.

Deron Johnson's three run homer in the first was enough to win. Chico Ruiz swiped his 44th base to set a new all-time Padre mark. Hawaii kept right on winning.

1963 LA Dodgers on the verge of celebrating another big victory

Start icing up that champagne because the pennant-bound Dodgers should be putting in their order any day now.

They had to drown their sorrow in beer a year ago but times have changed and barring some unforeseen catastrophe they should appear in their first World Series since 1959 six weeks from now.

To all intents and purposes, the Dodgers disposed of their last se-

rious challengers Wednesday night when they beat the St. Louis Cardinals, 2-1, in a 16-inning thriller for their seventh straight victory.

The triumph took them three hours and 43 minutes to achieve but it was worth it because they are now 7½ games in front with little chance of being headed off again.

A crowd of 54,125, largest of the year at Chavez Ravine, saw the Dodgers prevail when rookie Ken McMullen doubled off Ron Taylor in the 18th and came home on John Roseboro's single along the left field line.

Misses 20th Win

Southpaw Sandy Koufax failed in his bid to become the majors' first 20-game winner when he left after 12 innings with the score tied at 1-1. But he struck out 10 batters to raise his season total to 233, tops in the major leagues. St. Louis starter Curt Simmons departed after pitching 13 innings.

Elsewhere in the National League, the skidding San Francisco Giants dropped their fifth straight and tumbled to within a half game of fourth place when they were beaten by the Milwaukee Braves, 6-2, Houston blanked Cincinnati, 1-0, and Pittsburgh topped Chicago, 7-6.

The game between the Phillies and Mets was rained out.

The Yankees went 10 games up in the American League with a pair of 3-1 victories over the Indians, the White Sox ripped the Red Sox, 7-1, the Twins crushed the Tigers, 12-1, the Senators beat the Athletics, 5-1, and the Orioles scored a 7-4 win over the Angels in their opener but lost the nightcap, 3-2.

Eddie Mathews' 17th and 18th homers off Giant starter Gaylord Perry paced a 14-hit attack that brought the Braves their fifth straight victory.

Don Nottebart tossed the first shutout of his major league career and held the Reds to four hits in registering his eighth victory for the Colts.

Jerry Lynch set a major league record for pinch homers with the 15th of his career in the ninth inning to break a 6-all tie between the Pirates and Cubs.
