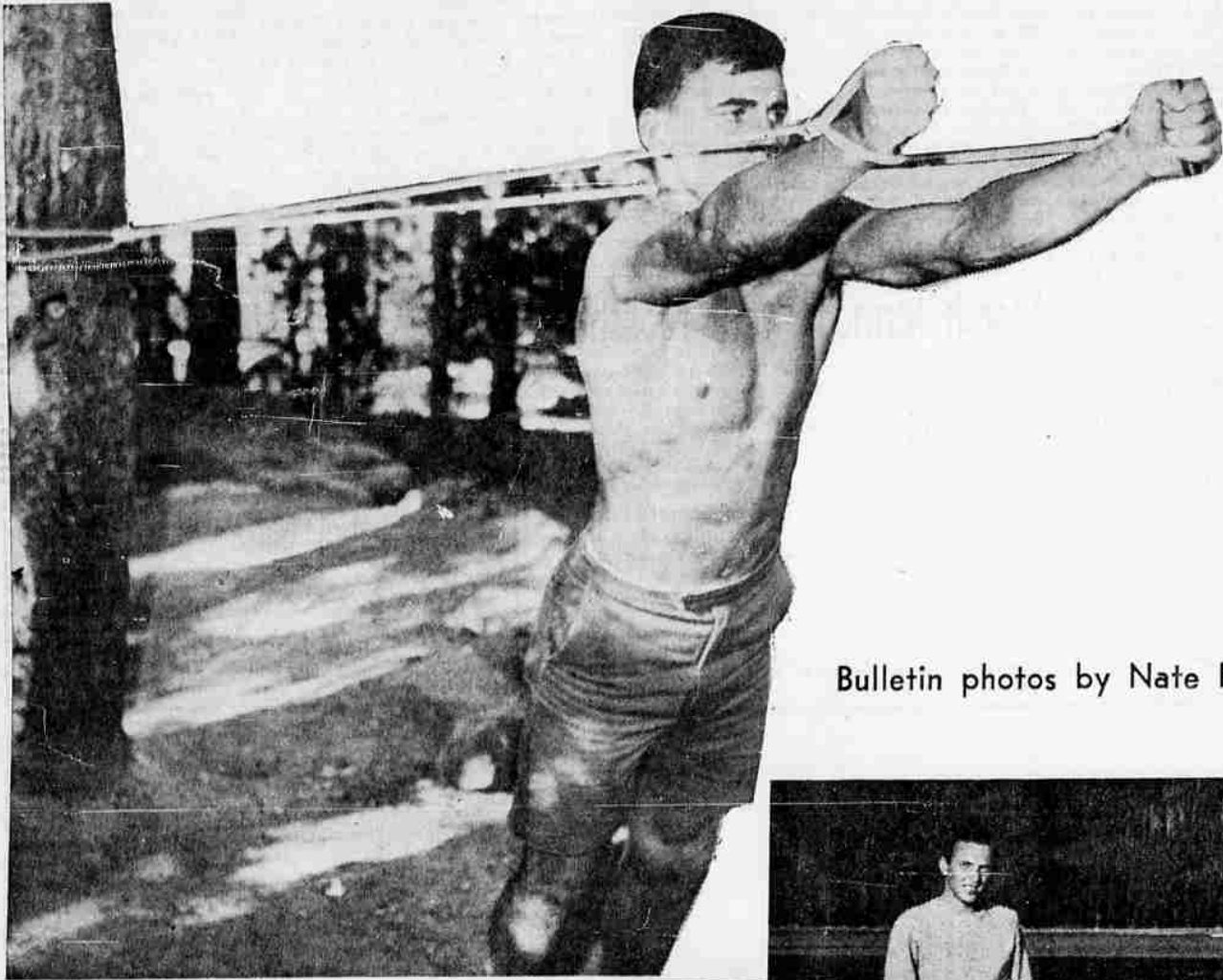
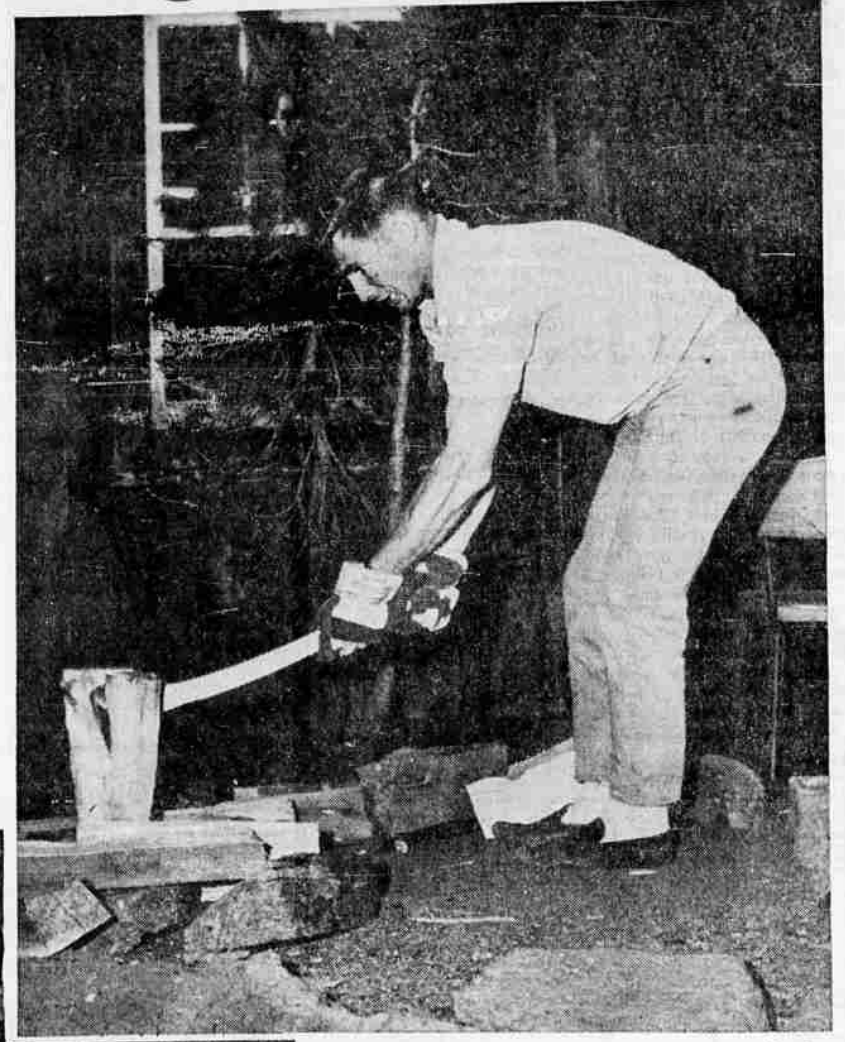


Olympic skiers train in Central Oregon at Bachelor
