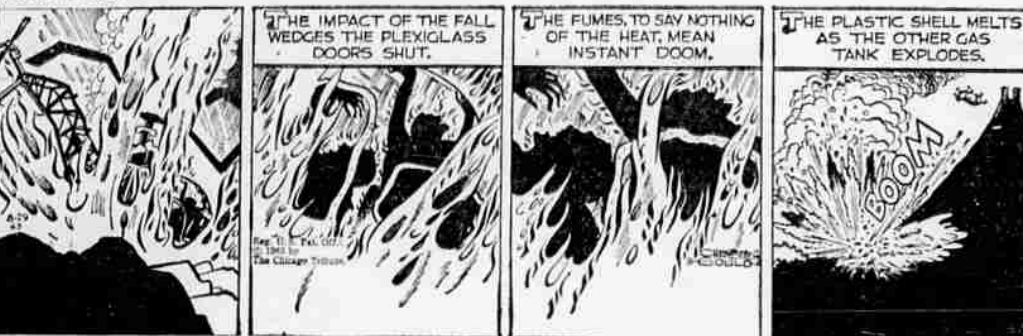

SUMMONS

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County.
INVESTORS INSURANCE CORPORATION, a corporation, Plaintiff, vs. WILLIAM R. MAYFIELD, husband and wife; HOMO J. KJAER and EMMA E. KJAER, husband and wife; E. R. HEITMAN and JANE DOE HEITMAN, husband and wife; ROBERT ESINGER, and also all other persons or parties unknown claiming any right, title, estate, lien or interest in the real property described in the complaint herein, Defendants.

TO: EMMA E. KJAER and also all other persons or parties unknown claiming any right, title, estate, lien or interest in the real property described in the complaint herein, Defendants.
IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON: You are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above-entitled Court and cause an answer to be filed on or before the expiration of four weeks from the date of the first publication of this summons; if you fail so to appear and answer, plaintiff for want thereof will apply to the above-entitled court for the relief prayed for in its complaint, to-wit:

1. Awarding plaintiff judgment, decree and execution against defendants William R. Mayfield, D. Marian Mayfield, H. R. Heitman and Homo J. Kjaer, and each of them, in the sum of \$35,393.41 with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum from May 1, 1962, until paid; in the further sum of \$83.50 with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum from July 23, 1963, until paid; in the further sum of \$2,115.74 plus \$200 per day or fraction thereof of trial and for plaintiff's reasonable attorney's fees herein and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements incurred herein.

2. Declaring plaintiff's said mortgage to be a first, valid and subsisting lien to secure payment of the sums provided in paragraph 1 above on the following described real property situated in Deschutes County, Oregon, to-wit:

The Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter NE1/4NW1/4, of Section Fifteen (15), Township Fifteen (15) South, Range Thirteen (13) East of the Willamette Meridian, with two exceptions as follows:

EXCEPTION NO. 1. Excepting the land conveyed, and subject to the easement granted, in that certain deed from F. H. Stickley and Gertrude Stickley, husband and wife, to Arthur W. Channess and Evelyn Channess, husband and wife, recorded in Book 86 on page 272, deed records of said County and State on May 22, 1948, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the south line of said NE1/4NW1/4, which said point is at a distance of 255.0 feet measured easterly along said south line from the southwest corner of the said NE1/4NW1/4; thence northerly along a line parallel with the west line of said NE1/4NW1/4 a distance of 232.0 feet; thence easterly along a line parallel with the south line of said NE1/4NW1/4 a distance of 178.0 feet; thence southerly along a line parallel with the west line of said NE1/4NW1/4 a distance of 232.0 feet to said south line of said NE1/4NW1/4; thence westerly along said south line of said NE1/4NW1/4 a distance of 178.0 feet to the point of beginning; Together with an easement for street and highway purposes in that certain road which runs from the south line of said NE1/4NW1/4, and which crosses said south line at a point westerly of the tract hereby excepted in a north easterly direction to the west line of the tract hereby excepted, and which easement shall be used in common with the said Stickleys and their successors in interest in favor of the remainder of said NE1/4NW1/4.

Together with an easement for a pipe line, said pipe line not to exceed two inches in size, extending from the North line of the tract hereby excepted, in a northeasterly direction to the stock pond located on said NE1/4NW1/4, with the right to repair and maintain same, and to install a pump in connection therewith at said stock pond.

EXCEPTION NO. 2. Excepting the land conveyed in that certain deed from F. H. Stickley and Gertrude Stickley, husband and wife, to Ivan L. J. Lantzer, recorded in Book 86 on page 274, Deed Records of said County and State, on May 22, 1948, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the south line of said NE1/4NW1/4, which said point is at a distance of 433.0 feet measured easterly along said south line from the Southwest corner of said NE1/4NW1/4; thence northerly along a line parallel with the west line of said NE1/4NW1/4 a distance of 150.0 feet; thence easterly along a line parallel with said south line of said NE1/4NW1/4 a distance of 290.0 feet; thence southerly along a line parallel with said west line a distance of 150.0 feet to said south line of said NE1/4NW1/4; thence westerly along said south line of said NE1/4NW1/4 a distance of 290.0 feet to the point of beginning.

3. Foreclosing said mortgage and decreeing that said real property be sold in the manner prescribed by law to satisfy the sums awarded to plaintiff hereunder, and awarding plaintiff further judgment, decree and execution against defendants William R. Mayfield, D. Marian Mayfield, H. R. Heitman and Homo J. Kjaer, and each of them, any and all other persons or parties claiming any interest in the real property properly applicable thereto to the satisfaction of the sums awarded to plaintiff, and decreeing that at said sale the purchaser or purchasers be let into possession of said real property and that plaintiff may be and become a purchaser at said sale.

4. Forever barring and foreclosing all the defendants herein of all right, title, interest, equity, lien and claim in, to and upon said real property, save and except only the right of redemption as provided by law.

5. For such other, further and different relief as the Court may deem just and equitable.
