LA plays tonight

Kicks provide Steeler win

Lou Michaels, the Pittsburgh Steelers' left-footed booter who established a National Football League record by kicking 26 field goals last year, is in mid-season form.

The former Kentucky All-America booted five field goals as the Steelers whipped the Detroit Lions, 22-7, in a tuneup game before 23,781 fans Friday night at Detroit.

Michaels' best kick of the night was his first — a 42-yarder in the second period. He added a 20-yarder in the third period and a really went to town in the final quarter with three-pointers from 36, 27 and 16 yards.

Glass Grabs Aerial

Glen Glass set up Pittsburgh's only touchdown — a one-yard plunge by John Henry Johnson —

when he intercepted an Earl Morrall pass on the Lion 27 in the second period and ran it back to the nine-yard line. Morrall saved the Lions from a shutout by tossing a 30-yard scoring pass to Gail Cogdill in the final period.

The Steelers' victory, avenging a 17-10 loss to Detroit in last season's playoff bowl game, left both clubs with 2-2 exhibition records.

Rookie halfback Jim Stiger scored two second-half touchdowns to lead the Dallas Cowboys to a 37-24 victory over the San Francisco Forty Niners at San Francisco, Calif. It was the fourth straight loss for the Forty Niners.

Four Games Tonight

Four more NFL tuneups will be played tonight. The Minnesota Vikings, unbeaten in three exhibitions, play the Philadelphia

Eagles at Hershey, Pa.; the Baltimore Colts, also 3-0, meet the Washington Redskins at Norfolk, Va.; the Chicago Bears entertain the St. Louis Cardinals in their annual Armed Forces game, and the Los Angeles Rams host the Cleveland Browns.

The defending champion Green Bay Packers tackle the New York Giants at Milwaukee Monday night in a replay of their 1962 playoff game.

In American Football League exhibitions tonight, the Houston Oilers and the Kansas City Chiefs play at Wichita, Kan., the Denver Broncos play the Buffalo Bills at Winston-Salem, N.C., and the Oakland Raiders meet the Chargers at San Diego. A Sunday game at New Brunswick, N.J., will pit the New York Jets against the Boston Patriots.

Lucky Chuck seeks to break Aussie skein

FOREST HILLS, N. Y. (UPI)

— Lucky Chuck McKinley of San Antonio, Tex., opens his bid today to break the seven-year Australian monopoly of the U. S. tennis championship.

McKinley, a bouncy, 5 foot, 8 inch blaster born in Missouri, waltzed to the Wimbledon crown earlier this summer without meeting a single seeded player and he'll probably go a long way in this one before meeting a tough competitor.

Chuck opens against Eduardo Zuleta of Ecuador and figures to have clear sailing to the semifinals, where he'll likely tangle again with Mexican Davis Cupper Rafael Osuna.

Osuna was steady for duty today against downed Jean Rouyer of France, who had to win a pair of qualifying matches to get into the championship draw.

First round matches Friday shed little light on how the new American power boys will fare against the top Aussies — Roy Emerson and Ken Fletcher — who threaten to give Australia its eighth title since Tony Trabert became the last Yank winner in 1953.

Dennis Ralston of Bakersfield, Calif., seeded third and McKinley's Davis Cup buddy, trounced young Walter Johnson of Hollywood, Fla., 6-1, 6-2, 6-2; and the second-seeded Emerson walloped Chauncey Steele III of Cambridge, Mass., in equally easy fashion, 6-1, 6-4, 6-2.

Bobby Wilson, member of England's European Cup champs and seeded sixth, trounced Jim Schnaars of Wayne, Pa., 6-4, 6-3, 6-2.

The top two gals — Australia's Margaret Smith and Darlene Hard of Long Beach, Calif. — make their debuts after drawing first round byes. Finalists last year, they're seeded 1-2 with the powerful Australian in the top spot as he fits the defending champ. She also won at Wimbledon.
