

Anniversary for Red boss

Khrushchev was named to most powerful post in Communist world just ten years ago today

MOSCOW (UPI) — Ten years ago today a former coal miner of peasant origin was elected to the most powerful job in the Communist world.

The man was Nikita S. Khrushchev and the job was first secretary of the Central Committee of the Soviet Communist party, which rules the Soviet Union.

Khrushchev, now 69, has been at the top of the Kremlin roost ever since, and is likely to stay there as long as he wishes. As he solidified his position during the decade, he added the premiership to his post of party chief.

The Kremlin boss is having his troubles with Communist China, farm deficiencies at home, soaring defense and space costs, and unrest among the country's intellectuals, but he apparently is untroubled about his position after 10 years.

Back On Vacation

Wednesday he left Moscow to resume the Black Sea vacation he interrupted for his recent 15-day visit to Yugoslavia.

Two weeks ago in Yugoslavia, Khrushchev donned a miner's uniform at the coal town of Ve-

lenje and told his hosts:

"I am sure the doctors won't let me go down the mine again but I will continue to serve in the post I now hold through the will of the party and people."

This was his way of telling the world that he intends to stay on the job for the rest of his life

Actually, Khrushchev became party chief about two weeks after Josef Stalin's death in March, 1953, when the late dictator's triumvirate of successors, Georgi Malenkov, Vyacheslav Molotov and Lavrenti Beria, apparently not trusting one another, decided to give the post to a relatively "harmless outsider."

The formal title of first secretary was conferred on him by a plenary session of the Central Committee on Sept. 12.

Overlooked By Others
Stalin's immediate successors had overlooked Khrushchev's extraordinary drive and political genius.

By midsummer of 1953, Beria, the police chief, was arrested and later executed as a spy.

A year later, Malenkov was ousted from the premiership. By June, 1957, he and Molotov, with half a dozen other old-guard Stalinists, were expelled from the Central Committee and discredited.

Khrushchev added the premiership in 1958 and for practical purposes became the "ruler of all the Russians."

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (UPI) —South Viet Nam's Mme. Ngo Dinh Nhu, who accused President Kennedy of appeasement, said today a visit to the United States for her may be like entering a "cage of lions."

The petite sister-in-law of South Vietnamese President Ngo Dinh Diem told newsmen she wants to go to America to counter all the "horrible things being said about me in the press."

She said the "great majority of Americans are good," but she added they must be told of the "plot" against her family's regime in Viet Nam and its han-

dling of Buddhist and student opposition. "But it may be as my brother cabled when he heard I may go to America—don't send her into the cage of lions," she said.

Talking to newsmen Wednesday night she accused President Kennedy of appeasement in connection with the trouble in South Viet Nam and said he was misinformed.

This morning, she flared in obvious anger when talking of reports that Washington had sought her husband's removal from power.

"This has been going on for two weeks," she said. "It is a terrible thing for America's reputation. I know I could never go to a foreign country and ask a foreigner to get out of his country."

She said removal of her husband from his position was desired in order to get him and her

out of South Viet Nam. "Why?" she asked. "Why do they want me out? It is my country. There is no reason to wish us out of it."

"It would please some people if I did get out. But I cannot do everything to please everybody just because I am a nice girl."

She said the "plot" against the Diem regime is "sabotage against the Kennedy administration and the Diem government is the winning card" in the Vietnamese struggle against the Communist guerrillas seeking to take over the entire country.

Asked to name the plotters, she said:

"My own father is a victim of this plot. I cannot name who is in the plot."

Her father recently resigned as Saigon's ambassador to Washing-

ton in protest to the government's handling of the Buddhist situation there.

The Diem government cracked down on the Buddhists in a series of raids and other moves in the wake of a political crisis that had built up because of Buddhist opposition. The Buddhists claimed religious discrimination, but the government denied it—saying the situation was political.
