UN visit by JFK seen in works

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (UPI) —President Kennedy is expected to make his first visit to the United Nations since 1961 for a policy speech to the General Assembly this month, informed sources said today.

"I am a Republican, pure and I hope not too simple," Goldwater said. "I accept that designation with pride and I wear the mantle with honor."

"Confusion" in Washington

"I do not accept any gradation with my Republican label. I am not a Fifth Amendment Republican, nor do I know any," he said.

"It may be there is a master design buried somewhere amidst the confusion that will emerge in time," he said.

Army chief says military guard best in history

MIAMI BEACH (UPI) — Gen. Earle G. Wheeler, Army chief of staff, said Wednesday the nation's military guard is better now than it ever has been in peacetime.

Wheeler spoke at the annual American Legion convention, which moved today to the election of a new commander-in-chief of the organization's 2.7 million veterans.

The Army is ready to meet with "flexible response (any) demand the security of the United States may pose for it," Wheeler said.

He said that, with the nuclear test ban treaty, the Communists could be expected to turn from nuclear pressures to "the activities of front organizations, propaganda, political and economic warfare, sabotage, infiltration, and indirect military actions" such as Viet Nam.

The cost of fighting in Southeast Asia — 59 American lives—has been high, Wheeler said, and "only the high stake... could justify this price."

The election will have all the trappings of a presidential nominating convention, including floor demonstrations for the nominees and brass bands.

The candidates expected to be nominated are Dan F. Foley of Wabasha, Minn., Donald E. Johnson of West Branch, Iowa, Joe L. Matthews of Fort Worth, Tex., and William J. Roberts of Auburn, Maine.

Frank Sinatra facing loss of his gambling license

CARSON CITY, Nev. (UPI) — Singer Frank Sinatra today faced loss of his 10-year-old Nevada gambling license on charges by the state gambling control board that he continually associated with a top national hoodlum.

A complaint filed with the state gambling commission Wednesday by board chairman Edward Olsen claimed that Sinatra and his staff at the Cal-Neva Lodge at Lake Tahoe gave "red carpet" treatment last July to Sam Giancana, 54, Chicago.

Giancana was identified in the complaint as one of the 12 overlords in Cosa Nostra, a group which allegedly runs the national crime syndicate.

He also is one of 11 persons listed in Nevada's "Black Book," which contains the names of those who are not welcome in the state's gambling halls.

The law which created the "Black Book" is aimed at keeping Nevada's legalized gambling industry free from the influence of known big-time racketeers.

Sinatra also was accused of threatening gambling board members with menacing language.

laced with "obscene and vile" comments, in an attempt to get them to drop the investigation into the relationship between him and Giancana.

The complaint said Sinatra had "maintained a continued social association with Giancana for a number of years." Olsen

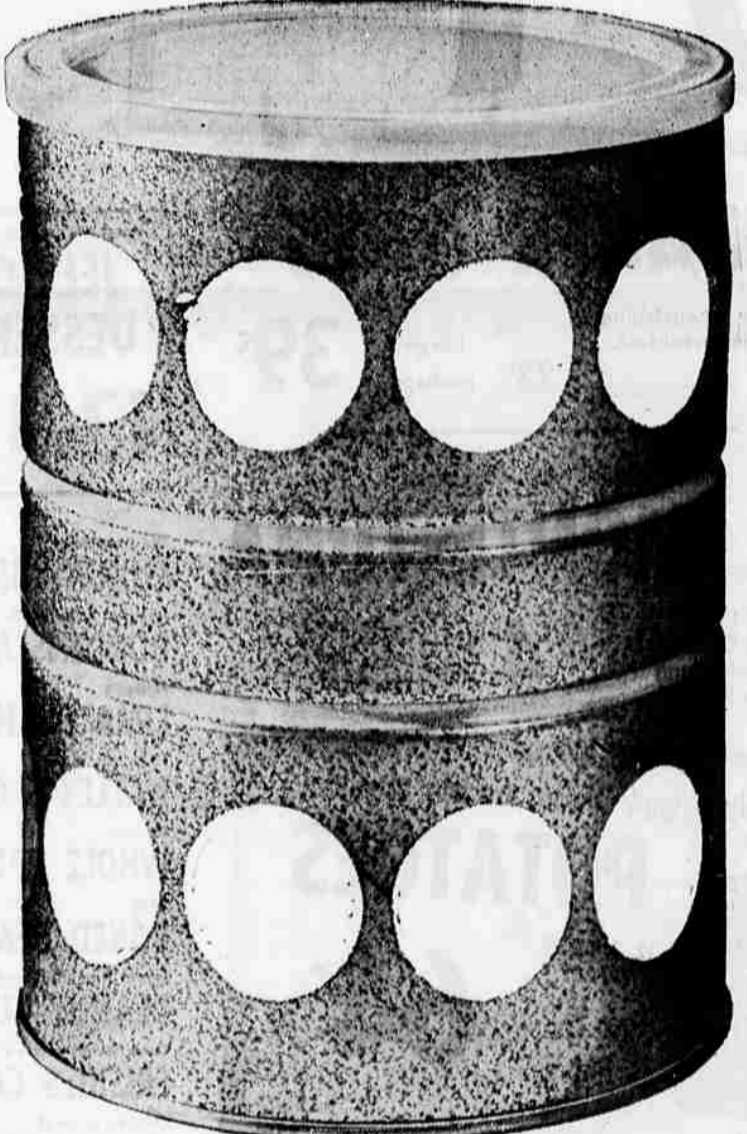
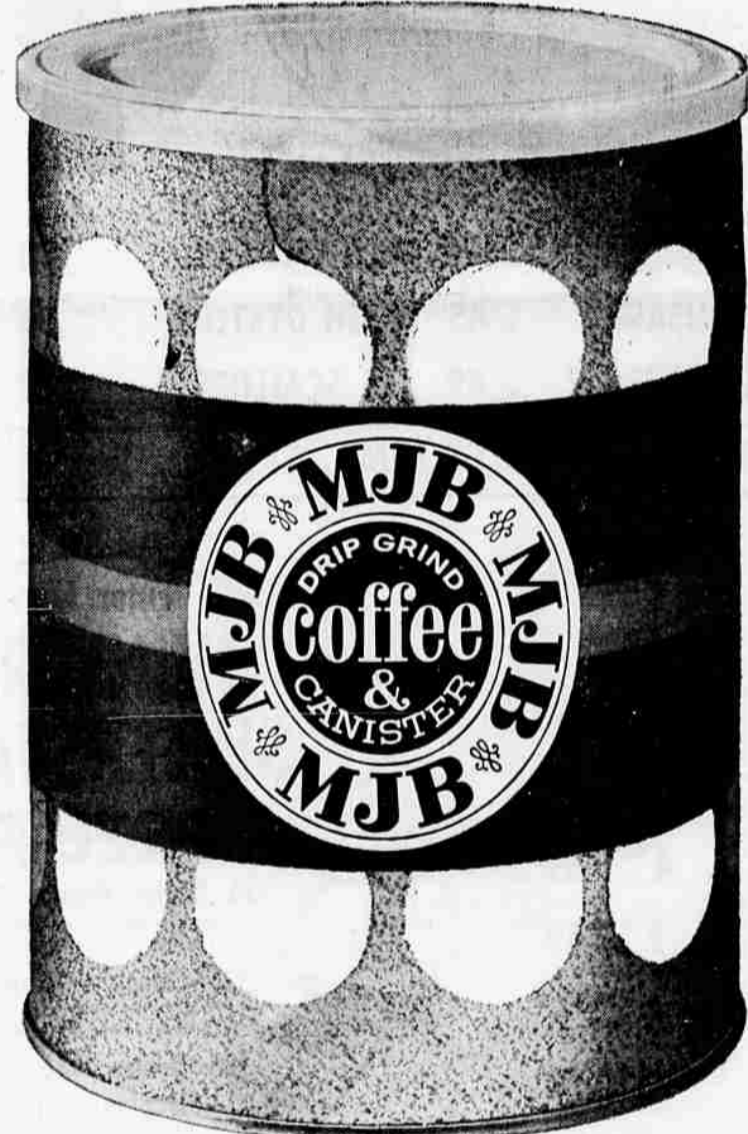
added that the singer "openly stated he intends to continue his friendship in defiance of the Nevada gambling code."

Sinatra has been licensed at the Cal-Neva since 1960 and holds 50 per cent of the multi-million-dollar resort hotel. He is in the process of buying the interests of

his partners, Henry Sanicola and Sanford Waterman.

The singer also was licensed in 1963 for nine per cent of the Sands Hotel in Las Vegas. If the complaint is proven true, Sinatra would be forced to sell both interests, estimated at \$3.5 million.
