## 'Copter sets survey tour over region

Vacationists who see a helicopter hopping from peak to peak in the southern Three Sisters wilderness area this coming week should not be alarmed.

It will be a 'copter on a U.S. Geological Survey mission—ground control survey work. Special permission to use the helicopter in the wilderness area was obtained from the U.S. Forest Service. Normally, the Forest Service does not permit even its own planes to enter the wilderness area, except in emergencies or in connection with fire control.

Cost of a survey involving crews moving through the rugged region, establishing camps and climbing peaks was a factor in the granting of permission to the USGS to use the helicopter, U.S. Forest Service officials said.

It is planned to start the helicopter work Monday. Most of the area to be covered will be west of Elk Lake, on the high Eugene side of the Cascades.

## Bridge work gets under way

Construction of a bridge across the upper Deschutes River at the Three Trappers' span site has been started, with Clayton and Associates, Madras, in charge, U.S. Forest Service engineers have announced.

The bridge will be over the Deschutes where it is crossed by a timber access road. The span will be 60 feet long and 24 feet wide, with treated timber sub-structure and pre-cast concrete decking.

The bridge will be completed in 60 days.

## Five passengers, two crew members burned as fishing boat explodes at Newport

NEWPORT, Ore. (UPI)—Five passengers and two crewmen were burned early today when the 25-foot fishing boat "Relief" exploded as it pulled away from a dock here. All were thrown into the water.

The Coast Guard said none of the passengers, members of the Trade and Commerce Committee of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, was hurt seriously. The captain, Joe Baker, Newport, suffered cuts on his foot. The crewman was Don Taylor, Newport.

The passengers were Carl H. Saltmarsh, Portland, general passenger agent of the Union Pacific Railroad; Don Franklin, Portland, Pacific Northwest Bell Telephone Co.; Paul Nordstrom, U.S. National Bank, Portland; E. A. Thirkell, Manning Packing Supply Co., Portland, chairman of the

Trade and Commerce Committee, and Gordon Hanson, Stinson Lumber Co., Forest Grove. Baker said he heard the engine

sputter as the boat pulled away for a charter fishing trip. He said he revved up the engine and it exploded. The boat burned, but did not sink.

The Relief was one of two boats carrying charter members on the fishing jaunt. Seven members were aboard another craft which pulled alongside and crewmen and passengers offered help to the stricken craft.

Thirkell and Hanson were hospitalized at Newport. The others were treated and released.

Twenty-four members of the chamber were on a coast tour, but only 12 decided to go on the fishing trip. The mishap occurred when the Relief was about 50 yards from the dock.
