Sunny weather returns to area

Sunny weather returned to Central Oregon this morning, following a September storm early in the week that whitened Cascade peaks, and clearing weather last night that dropped Bend's temperatures to 32 degrees.

It was the lowest temperature for the night reported from any part of the United States, Alaska and Hawaii excluded. Mullan, Idaho and Redmond came in second in the low temperature column with readings of 35 degrees.

Bend's low for the night actually was registered at sunrise, as rays of the sun tinted vapors rising from the Deschutes.

Forecasters indicate that fair weather will continue in Central Oregon for a few days, with variable afternoon clouds and with temperatures in the low 70s.

Tonight's low is expected to be around 34 degrees in the Bend area.

The five day forecast for counties east of the Cascades calls for showers late in the week, after Thursday. In that same period, moderate moisture is expected in western Oregon.

There were fog patches west of the Cascades this morning.
