Advance sign-up 738 less than one year ago

EUGENE (UPI)—Advance registration for freshmen and new students at Oregon's higher education institutions was 738 below advance registration for a comparable period last year, it was learned today.

Higher education registration officials said enrollment figures could change drastically in the next few days, however.

Officials said "meaningful" college enrollment figures probably would not be available until sometime next week.

The preliminary figures showed only Oregon Technical Institute and Southern Oregon College had increased advance registration of freshmen and new students.

OIT was up to 641 from last year's 540, and SOC jumped to 1,174 from last year's 992. The University of Oregon was down to 4,679 from last year's 4,670, Portland State had 2,633 this year compared to 2,613, Oregon College of Education had 634 compared to 711, Eastern Oregon was down to 504 from last year's 569, and Oregon State University had 4,411 compared to last year's 4,557.

Near drowning sparks interest in first aid

The near drowning Saturday of a Bend child, Debra Manwiller, who was saved by mouth-to-mouth resuscitation administered by Lowell Jensen, prompted several Bend women to request a Red Cross class in first aid.

The first session will be Monday, September 30, at 1:30 p.m. in the parlors of the First Baptist Church, 60 Oregon Avenue. Everyone interested is invited to attend.

Mrs. James Fellows, a certified volunteer instructor, will teach the course. There will be five classes of two hours each. At the first meeting, those participating will decide whether to have one or two classes each week.

Mrs. Ted W. Coulter, one of the women made aware by the near-tragedy of the importance of first aid training, requested that a new course be scheduled. Mrs. Clare T. Taylor, Deschutes County Red Cross chapter secretary, said the women realized that in such an emergency as that which occurred at an irrigation canal south of Bend, they would be unable to give assistance.

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
