

Bank manager at Prineville one of 3 hunting fatalities

The first day of Oregon's general deer hunting season Saturday resulted in three deaths, two caused by heart attacks and one by a fall.

John Candler, 70, of Grants Pass died while packing a deer out of a wooded area near Kings Cabin in northern Klamath County. He had shot the buck while hunting with two other men.

James McWilliams, 51, manager of the Prineville Branch of the First National Bank, died while hunting with friends in the Spring Creek area about 40 miles west of Burns.

James Allen Murray, 20, of Portland died in Tillamook General Hospital of internal injuries suffered when he fell about 60 feet off a cliff near the Hembrie Ridge Lookout 20 miles east of Tillamook.

Four traffic deaths counted over weekend

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Four Oregon residents died during the weekend as a result of traffic accidents.

Chester Jefferson, 75, Salem, was struck and killed by a car on U.S. Highway 20, 11 miles west of Sisters Sunday night.

Barbara Shanley, 8, Clackamas, died when hit by a car while riding her bicycle near her home Sunday night.

Charles Gipton, 46, Ontario, died at a Boise hospital Saturday night from injuries suffered in a traffic crash near Council, Idaho, Sept. 14.

Donna Clutter, 2, Charleston, died at a Medford hospital Friday night from injuries received when she was struck by a car near her home during the day.

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Ernie McCullough, 35, Artesia, Calif., was accidentally shot in the left thigh north of Lakeview by his brother, Earl, of Powers. Authorities said the victim apparently was mistaken for a wounded deer. He was hospitalized in Lakeview with a fractured leg.

Lewis Young, 56, Springfield, was struck in the face by shotgun pellets fired by a 14-year-old boy. Young was leading a group of young hunters at the game management farm north of Corvallis. He was treated at a Corvallis hospital and released.

Elmo G. Lambert, Portland, was shot in the right arm while hunting Saturday near Fossil.

Michael Carlson, 16, Oregon City, was injured early Sunday when he accidentally shot himself in the leg when he returned from a hunting trip. He was treated and released at a hospital.

Jedie Garner, 17, Mapleton, accidentally shot himself through the upper arm while he and companions were packing a deer out of the Woods near Falls City in Polk County.

He was treated by a doctor at Dallas.

Blast victims set at seven

MOSES LAKE, Wash. (UPI)—The bodies of two men were brought in Sunday from the Utah and Idaho sugar plant which was struck by a series of explosions last Wednesday.

The total number of dead in the explosion now stands at seven. Rescue crews pulled the body of William Yessack, 32, from the wreckage of what made up—until last Wednesday—two silos, each 150 feet high.

Two hours after finding Yessack's body, searchers found that of Juan Roland "Joe" Hain, 39.

REDMOND — A total of 1018 cattle went through the ring Thursday at the annual Deschutes County Cattleman's feeder sale at the Redmond Auction Yard, nearly twice as many as were sold at the last week's regular sale.

Good - choice slaughter steers brought 21.85-23.50 and standard quality, 20.70-21. Good slaughter heifers sold for 19.20-60; commercial cows, 13.25-16.25; utility, 12-25-14, and canner - cutter, 8.70-12.30. Utility - commercial bulls sold for \$14.90-10, and feeders, 15.50-25.10.

Baby calves sold by the head, beef and beef mixed bringing 10-57.50, and Holsteins, 21-35. Good-choice feeder steers, 500-700 lbs., brought 22.10-25.20, representing a rise of \$1 to \$1.50 over last week. Common - medium steers, 400-700 lbs., went for \$15.60-19.10; good-choice heifers, 500-700 lbs., 19-23-50; common - medium, 400-700 lbs., 15-25-17.20.

Good - choice steer calves, 300-500 lbs., sold for 24.25-27.90; common - medium, 250-500 lbs., 20.60-24.70; good - choice heifer calves, 300-500 lbs., 20.60-24.70; common - medium, 250-500 lbs., 15.50-18. Medium - good stock cows sold by the head, bringing 137.50-150. Medium - good pairs of cows and calves went for 177.50-195.

U.S. No. 1 and 2 market hogs brought 16.20; U.S. 3, 15.25; sows, 8.60-9.10, and feeders, 13.25-15.

Good - choice slaughter lambs brought 15.25-17; feeder lambs, 13-14.25, and ewes, \$10 per head.

Hunters praised for care with fires over weekend

U.S. Forest Service officials, from the Winema woods up through the Deschutes timber to the Ochoco hills, paid tribute today to hunters for "their splendid cooperation in guarding the dry timber against fire."

Hunters, it was declared, set an all-time safety with fire record over the arid, hot, gusty weekend.

In the entire Deschutes forest, only one forest fire occurred. It was small, hardly more than a warming fire that broke over its bounds. It was in the Metolius River area. Guards found five campfires that had been left burning and might have spread into the woods, and five left burning in safe places.

The Ochoco woods reported only one hunter fire and one lighting fire over the weekend. Both fires accounted for about an acre. "We would like to commend hunters for their splendid cooperation," Ochoco forest officials said.

With extremely dangerous weather prevailing, the Fremont listed only three fires as man caused. Total acreage was only a little more than one and a half. One Fremont hunter left his campfire burning. It spread, burned up his pickup and all camp gear.

The Malheur reported only two hunter caused fires over the weekend. Acreage was small.

The foresters also joined today in commending the "fine cooperation of the thousands of hunters who were in the woods in an extremely dangerous weekend."
