Still gold in 'them thar hills' state geologist tells clubmen

There may be plenty of gold remaining in "them thar hills," but Oregon's Department of Geology and Mineral Industries hasn't the time to seek out new lodes — it has more pressing work directly concerned with the development of the state. This was indicated here Tuesday by Hollis M. Dole, state geologist, in a talk before Bend Lion Club members.

2 new lookout buildings due

The Portland office of the Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, today announced plans for construction of two fire lookout buildings in Oregon. The project will include buildings constructed in two levels, size 15' 6" by 15' 6" each with frame type construction for the upper levels and concrete block with concrete floors on the lower levels. One of the project sites is located in the Riddle Mountain area near Diamond, Oregon, in Harney County; the Green Mountain site is located near Fort Rock, Oregon, in Lake County.

G. C. Edgett, executive vice president of the WCLA, said the Commerce Department has proposed a 20 per cent sampling of lumber producing and lumber user trade associations. This would reduce the volume of ballots to be counted.

Long range improvement plans mullied by fair board

REDMOND — Directors of the Deschutes County fair board met Tuesday night with Warren Carkin, Salem architect, and Dwight Fairbanks of Oregon State University to discuss long range plans for improvements of the fairgrounds in Redmond. Among changes considered most urgent is relocation of the main entrance to the west side of the grounds on 11th Street.

Considerable discussion was given to possible construction of a main exhibit building. Carkin recommended that a committee be appointed to determine most urgent needs of each phase of the fair, and that a ways and means group be named to study fund

NAACP may file new complaints

PORTLAND (UPI)—The local chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) indicated today it was studying the possibility of filing more civil rights complaints against the Portland Housing Authority.

A complaint was filed with the State Civil Rights Commission Monday by Jimmie Proctor, a Negro who said he filed an application for an apartment in the new Northwest Towers nearly two years ago and was told he was high on the list.

The NAACP has called for the resignation of top housing authority officials, who have denied there is discrimination.

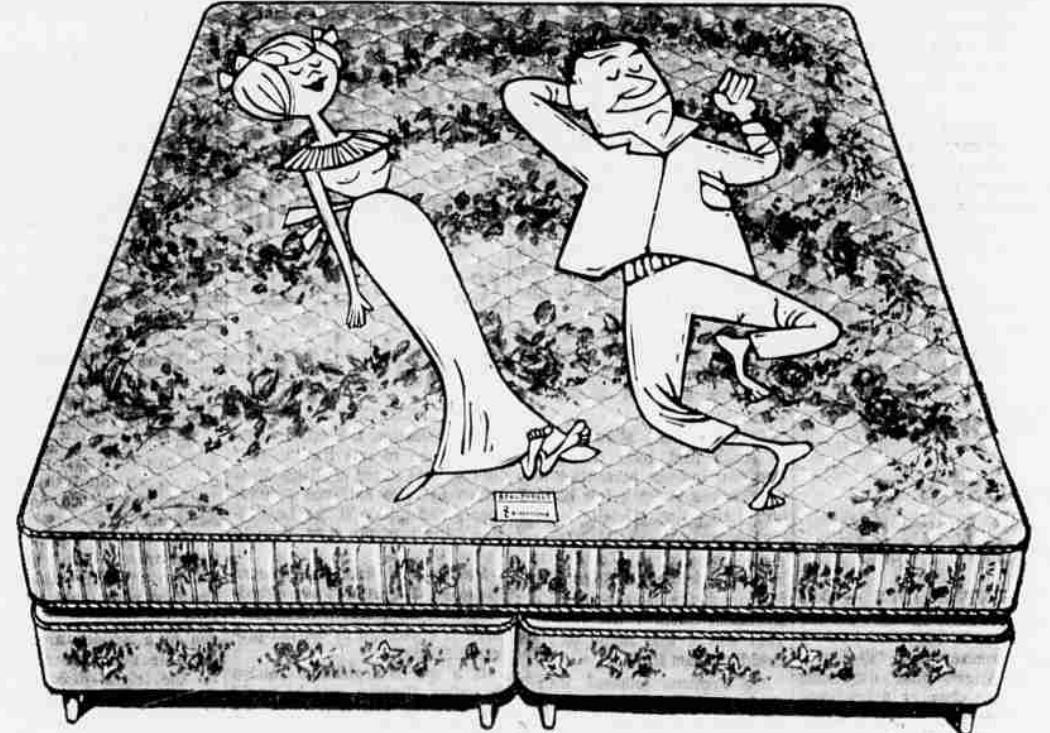
Commission meets tonight
