# Favorable vote given zone plan on apartments

Bend city fathers last night disregarded Planning Commission counsel and voted to allow the inclusion of apartment dwellings in a special category of the zoning ordinance.

Hatfield said he was asking for a favorable vote on the tax measure Oct. 15 because of harm the reduction would cause state services and programs.

He also said the state might be getting closer to a sales tax because more people who formerly opposed a sales tax have told him they now think it is time for a new money source.

Opponents of the legislature's tax bill feel government has grown too expensive, but that they show no clear-cut consensus on what should be done, the governor said.

Other tax front comments: State Sen. Thomas R. Mahoney, D-Portland, said he thought the tax bill would "go down by two to one."

# Vacancy due on Tumalo water board

Vogt has served on the board for the past three years. Carry-over members are Bob Beesley and Kenneth E. Speakman. Terms of all board members run for three years.

Candidates for membership on the three-man board must be residents of the Tumalo Irrigation District.

# Jackpines step into Christmas tree spotlight

Once lowly jackpines of the Deschutes country stepped into the Christmas spotlight here Wednesday at an auction characterized by highly competitive bidding and record prices for the lodgepoles.

A total of 3,050 trees were sold at the auction, held in the Deschutes National Forest headquarters in Bend. Jackpines sold at higher prices than Shasta firs. Offerings of trees suitable for Christmas use were listed in all five districts of the Deschutes National Forest.

Most of the trees will be shipped to California markets. Successful bidders for trees from the various areas follow:

# U.S. may have new proposal

TOKYO (UPI) — The United States filed to raise the subject of adjournment at the 12th session of the North Pacific Fisheries treaty conference here, leading to speculation that it may have a further proposal to offer.

American negotiators proposed to Japan Tuesday that the conference be terminated. The move side so far has given the ground on the main area of disagreement — the controversial 100-mile clause.

The United States wants the clause, which calls for voluntary abstention by the Japanese from fishing for salmon and halibut east of 175 degrees west longitude, kept in the 10-year-old treaty.

The Japanese want it removed, and formulas for fishing the area, within the reasonable bounds of conservation practice, established by scientific fish census and analysis of fish reproductive abilities.

Canada, which also is a party to the treaty and the regulations, has indicated that it may be a little less rigid on the clause.

The argument basically revolves around the demand of American and Canadian fishermen that salmon and halibut — for which they generally fish along the continental shelf and in estuaries along the West Coast — not be taken in the open ocean.
