Koufax breaks 2 World Series pitching marks

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—Seven-teen individual records and 22 club records were set during the 1963 World Series.

Sandy Koufax of the victorious Dodgers established the most prominent marks—most strikeouts by a pitcher in one game (15) and most strikeouts in one series (23).

Whitely Ford of the Yankees broke seven records — including most series games lost (7). He also has won the most series games (10).

ground attack here Friday afternoon and then hung on tenaciously for a 26-20 8-man Deschutes loop victory over Wheeler County.

Culver's Bulldogs, thus achieved the honor of being the only prep squad in Central Oregon that picked up a victory this weekend.

Coch Clarence Namenuk just couldn't heap enough praise on his star back, Rick Urbach, this morning. "He did everything," Namenuk said, "not only was he race horse all day on offense, but he did a tremendous job on defense."

Namenuk also cited his other backs Stan Earnest and Bob Van Orsow for their driving action. Bob Simmons made several nice catches.

Fought Dust

In order to pick up the victory, Namenuk's Bulldogs had to fight the dust of Wheeler County and then mechanical malfunctions of the school bus on the trip home.

If the Bulldogs hadn't won, it would've been a miserable weekend. Joe Valls tallied the first TD when he dashed the ball over from 12 yards out. Immediately after the kickoff that followed, Urbach intercepted a Wheeler aerial and returned it to the Falcon 5.

Culver couldn't capitalize on the break, however, and four plays netted the Bulldogs almost nothing. Later in the initial quarter, Urbach, Earnest and Van Orsow chopped off short ground gainers before Urbach churned the last 15 yards to paydirt. Van Orsow booted the extra point.

42 Yard Drive

A 42-yard march in the second stanza gave the Bulldogs another TD. Urbach got the TD. The touchdown was set up by a key pass from Earnest to Simmons, covering 20 yards. It was 20-6 at the half. Wheeler had scored with a ground attack of its own before the half ended.

Ten plays from scrimmage in the third quarter covered 76 yards and Culver had another TD. This tally was set up by another key pass, this time coming from Urbach and to Earnest. Urbach picked up the TD, however, on a short gallop.

Wheeler, not to be denied, picked up two TD's, one in the third and another in the final period. A final drive in the last three minutes might have pulled the game out for the Falcons, had Culver not stopped an earlier Falcon drive.

Wheeler, running from a weird 8-man shotgun, scored the final TD, a 29-yard sideline run.

PORTLAND (UPI) — Quarter-back Gordon Queen lost a passing battle with Baylor's Don Trull Saturday night, but he won the war with a last-minute touchdown pass that gave Oregon State a 22-15 football victory.

Queen, who completed 11 of 22 passes for 191 yards, hit Danny Espalin on a nine-yard scoring pass with 27 seconds left to give the unbeaten Beavers their third win of the year and their 10th in a row.

The Beavers didn't score on that break, but they got the ball again with 66 yards to go and only 4:09 left. A 15-yard penalty set OSU back to its 19, and Queen took over.

He hit Vern Burke for 17, Espalin for 12, Doug McDougal for 19 and 13, and finally Espalin again for 9 and the touchdown. Espalin, the smallest man on the field at 5-8 and 167, grabbed the ball on the five, fumbled it on

the two, and then fell on it in the end zone.

LeRoy Whittle's 26-yard scoring run and a Queen-to-Burke conversion pass gave Oregon State an 8-0 lead in the first quarter. Full-back Bruce Williams tallied on a one-yard plunge after an 80-yard drive in the second period to make it 15-0.

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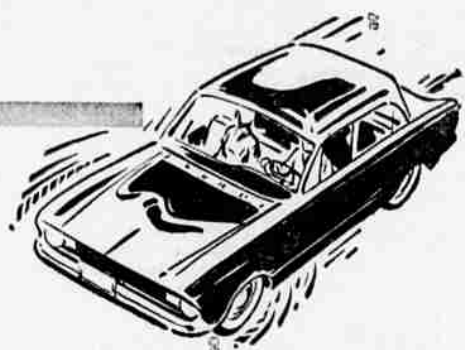
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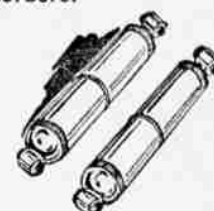
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
