Game men to release chukars

Game officials this year again will be releasing adult pheasant cocks and adult chukars on the Central Oregon grasslands in the vicinity of Gray Butte to provide hunting for the public, the Bend office of the Oregon State Game Commission announced today.

Len Mathison, regional supervisor, said that weather permitting, the game officials plan to release 400 adult cock pheasants and 500 adult chukars on the Cyrus Springs pasture, the same area as last year.

On the third or fourth weekend of the season we will make a second release.

Last year the local office provided over 600 hunter days of recreation on public lands in just two weekends, with more expended during the weeks that were not recorded. Hunter success was good. Hunter success was 2.2 birds per hunter the first weekend and 2.0 birds per hunter on the second release. Fifty-six per cent of the birds released on the first weekend and 83 per cent of the birds released on the third weekend.

Tomorrow, Friday, marks the first release for this year.

Christiansen unhappy with 49'er offense

REDWOOD CITY, Calif. (UPI) — Coach Jack Christiansen was not impressed by the San Francisco Forty Niners' offense after looking both at their practice session and latest National Football League statistics.

Latest NFL figures show that the Forty Niners have moved the ball for fewer yards than any team in the league—only 738 in four contests.

Quarterbacks Bob Water and Lamar McLean, both vying for the starting job, did plenty of passing in Wednesday's offensive workout.

The coach said "they didn't look good, and they didn't look bad—they just looked fair." Considering the fact that both looked bad last Sunday at Detroit, this signified some improvement.

Guard John Thomas, who pulled a leg muscle, missed the drill and looks like a doubtful participant in Sunday's battle at Baltimore. But halfback Don Lisbon did some more running despite a pulled hamstring and should be able to perform against the Colts.

Christiansen said that he had not heard much about the Colts except that "Lenny Moore is back, and that gives us enough problems to worry about." However, two other top Baltimore receivers, Ray Berry and Jimmy Orr, will probably miss Sunday's game.

Baltimore edged the Forty Niners 20-14 in their first meeting a month ago.

Christiansen noted that Baltimore traditionally does not rush linebackers in on the passers as much as Detroit. But he predicted the Colts would be red-dogging plenty Sunday after noting the Lions' success in the same maneuver last Sunday.

The yards gained passing by the Forty Niners against Detroit plus the yards lost trying to pass by the Prospectors equaled minus ten—lowest total in the history of the team.

UO's Berry 4th in total offense

NEW YORK (UPI) — Oregon quarterback Bob Berry is fourth in the nation in total offense, according to NCAA statistics released Wednesday.

Berry has gained 537 yards this season.

Oregon State end Vern Burke is fourth in the scoring race with 26 points and Beaver halfback Charlie Shaw is sixth in rushing offense with 268 yards in 37 carries.

Another Oregon player in the top ten category is end Dick Imwalle, who is eighth in pass receptions with 11, good for 177 yards.

Redmond family buys Cline Falls riding arena

REDMOND — Mr. and Mrs. Al Eppenbaugh's indoor riding arena near Cline Falls has been sold to a Redmond family, it was announced today.

Purchase of Central Oregon's leading riding facility was made by Dr. and Mrs. Maurice Pendroy. The Pendroy's have changed the name to the Redmond Riding Arena.

Work is now underway, preparing for the winter season. Improvements also are being made in the spectator facilities. Heaters are being installed.

Dick Wilde, a prominent trainer from Vale who has been training horses privately at the arena for the past eight months, will remain as manager, trainer and instructor. Wilde this season has won the "All-Around" Championship at the P-I in Eugene, and last month at the Redmond Quarter Horse Show during the Spud Festival.

Wilde and his family will live at the arena and offer 24-hour service for quartered horses. He offers training and instruction in cow cutting, roping, and riding (for both beginners and advanced students). He also takes a limited number of horses for shoeing.

A tentative schedule has been drawn up for the weekly events. Beginning November 1 the slate runs: Tuesday nights, cow cutting practice under the auspices of the Central Oregon Cutting Horse Assn. Wednesday nights, calf roping and bulldogging. Thursday nights, ladies' night for drills, pleasure and training. Friday nights, team roping.

Clay wants Liston first

Bill Faversham, who acts as spokesman for the 11 businessmen sponsoring the Louisville Lip's career, made this plain Wednesday in response to an announced offer from Seattle for a fight with top-ranking light heavyweight Eddie Cotton.
