Brown, Tittle can set NFL grid records Sunday

Jimmy Brown of the Cleveland Browns and Y. A. Tittle of the New York Giants can set significant National Football League records Sunday, but chances are their individual goals will be subordinated to their all-out efforts to win the Big Game.

Pre-teen basketball organizing

PHILADELPHIA — Pre-teen basketball is being organized on a national basis and the program will be known as "P.T." basketball leagues.

Any youngster who has not reached his 13th birthday by December 1 of the playing year is eligible for participation in the cage program.

Any league with a minimum of four teams can apply for a franchise in the P.T. movement. Areas will be divided into districts and post-season tournaments will be staged to determine state winners and a national champion. Awards also will be given to members of all-star teams, most valuable players, etc.

This program will be patterned along the same lines as various teenage baseball programs and is open to all boys who come into the age bracket.

Applications are now being accepted for the 1963-1964 season and interested organizations may obtain all information and application by writing to Lew Di Leo, 928 Western Saving Fund Bldg., Philadelphia, 7, Pa.

Brown can become the league's all-time rushing leader and Tittle can pass the retired Bobby Layne as the NFL's top man in pass-completions.

Brown's success in achieving that goal will depend on the Sunday performance of Joe (The Jet) Perry of the San Francisco Forty Niners who holds the league record of 8,296 rushing yards. Brown goes into the Giants game trailing Perry by 73 yards.

Tittle needs 15 pass completions to top Layne's career mark of 1,814.

Obviously, both will be willing to forego records this weekend if it means winning this battle in New York for the Eastern Division lead. Oddsmakers have made the Giants 3-point favorites for their home-opening game that will attract a sellout crowd of more than 62,000 at Yankee Stadium. Cleveland has won four straight games.

The St. Louis Cardinals, who like the Giants are tied for second place with a 3-1 record, figure to stay in contention. The Cards are 3-point picks for their home-opener against the Pittsburgh Steelers (2-1-1).

It looks like no stopping the Chicago Bears (4-0) or the Green Bay Packers (3-1) in the Western Division. Both are 13-point choices, the Bears over the Rams at Los Angeles and the Packers over the Vikings at Minnesota.

In Sunday's three other games, the Washington Redskins are the choice by 3 points at home over the Philadelphia Eagles; the Detroit Lions are favored by 5 to send the Cowboys down to their fifth straight defeat, at Dallas; and the Colts are picked by 13 to do likewise to the San Francisco Forty Niners at Baltimore.

2 Bend hunters each bag moose, caribou on trip

Back from the Alaskan wilds north of Tok in the east central part of the new state, two Bend hunters, Ed Park and Ed Dealy, have some advice for nimrods seeking big game in the land of tundras, lakes and mountains: "Don't bag a moose at the edge of a cold lake just before dark."

Park got his moose under such circumstance, and spent part of a freezing night getting it into shore. Block and tackle were finally used.

Dealy and Park returned to Bend with some 900 pounds of fine boned meat. Each of the hunters got a moose and a caribou.

Part of the northern experience included floats down the Tanana and Tok Rivers in rubber boats. They saw plenty of wildlife — lynx, coyotes, foxes and bears, not to mention the caribou and moose. The caribou were "outliers" from a herd of some 17,000 moving through the region. However the Bend men did not see the main herd.

Park and Dealy encountered some cold weather, including a snow storm. Tok is east of Fairbanks, near the Yukon border. They drove all the way to Tok, in Park's car.

Park obtained pictures and material for articles he plans to write for a national sports publication. Dealy is range ecologist with the Bend Research Center of the U.S. Forest Service.

Rams put three on 'waivers'

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—The Los Angeles Rams Thursday put Ed Duane Allen, defensive halfback Al Hall and center Ken Kirk on waivers and replaced them with three men from the club's "taxi squad."

Tackle Stan Fanning and defensive backs Nat Whitmyer and John Griffin may see action against the Chicago Bears at Memorial Coliseum this Sunday as replacements for the three put on waivers.

Fanning was formerly with the Bears while Whitmyer is a former University of Washington player and Griffin is from Memphis State.

AFL wars to get tighter

The scramble in the American Football League will get even tighter this weekend if the odds-makers are as accurate as usual.

The two top teams after four games, the New York Jets and the San Diego Chargers, collide in San Diego Sunday afternoon with identical 3-1 records. The Chargers, 10-point favorites, are just a step ahead of Kansas City in the western division while New York is the only team in the eastern division to better the .500 mark at this stage.

The Boston Patriots, tied with Houston for the eastern runner-up spot, launch the league's sixth round of games by hosting the Oakland Raiders Friday night.

Boston, a 4-point pick, will be employing the Fenway Park home of baseball's Red Sox for the first time.

The rest of the AFL program lists Houston at Denver in a toss-up game and Buffalo a 9-point underdog at Kansas City, both on Sunday afternoon.

Pheasant, quail season opens

PORTLAND (UPI) — Oregon's pheasant and quail season opens Saturday at 8 a.m., with prospects good in most parts of the state.

One exception to the Saturday opener is Malheur County, where the season will open Oct. 26.

In western Oregon, hunting prospects look best in Marion, Clackamas, Yamhill and Washington counties, and in the Medford-Sama Valley area of the Rogue Valley, according to the State Game Commission.

Linfield ranks 8th in grid poll

The Wildcats, unbeaten in three games this season, collected 71 points.

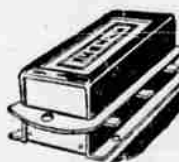
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
