Outlaws move up notch in Class B, 8-man loop

Coach Gene McDonald's Sisters Outlaws moved up a notch in the Deschutes League standings this week after their smashing 4-13 victory last Friday at Arlington.

Other than that, however, the standings for the Class B 8-man loop remain unchanged. Dufur stays atop the heap with two wins and no losses or ties. Cascade Locks bears a weird one win, one tie combination to remain a trifle ahead of Sisters who has two wins and a loss.

Sisters' loss was to Dufur. And that contest two weeks ago very well may have decided the loop crown. There appear two strong teams in the league: Sisters and Dufur. Culver looms as a dark horse.

Coach Clarence Namenek's Culver-ites are in a solid fourth place with a win, a loss and a tie. Arlington's defeat Friday by Sisters puts it almost as far in the cellar as Wheeler County (Fossil). Arlington has no wins and two losses. Wheeler has three defeats against no victories.

This is the first year that the Wasco County crew (Dufur) has been in the picture, and two weeks ago was the first time in 13 years that Dufur has beaten the Outlaws.

When the rains came it really poured. Dufur handed Sisters

a 44-20 shellacking, hinting that nobody in the loop is going to give the Dufur-men a contest for the Deschutes flag.

Perhaps the only chance for a change in the Dufur supremacy comes October 25 when the Wasco-men must face Cascade Locks. The Arlington - Sisters fray was the only contest last week.

Sisters draws a bye this Friday, and Culver hosts Arlington. Culver drew a bye last week. A win Friday against Arlington will put the Bulldogs into nearly a second place tie with the Outlaws.

Detroit out of picture for '68 Olympics, French say

BADEN-BADEN, Germany (UPI)—An official of Lyons, France says "there is no question" his city will host the 1968 Olympic games.

Tony Bertrand, the Lyons representative also said Tuesday that "Detroit hasn't got a hope. We're going to win hands down."

Lyons and Detroit are two of four cities bidding for the games. Mexico City and Buenos Aires are the others. Their representatives have been meeting here with delegates to the International Olympic Committee.

Bertrand's remarks came just after Detroit presented a nine-point program to the committee

detailing why the Michigan city should be selected.

In addition to the question of a site for the 1968 games, the IOC discussed a number of other topics including fanfare and national anthems; the German and Indonesian political problems; and amateurism.

Tuesday's caucus did not make any decisions. A spokesman said it was set up to "sound out feelings and suggestions of the various National Olympic Committees."

The spokesman also said that decisions can be made only on the floor at the full congress session beginning Thursday.

Viks to give big Ferguson last chance

The Minnesota Vikings are giving Bob Ferguson a second chance.

Ferguson, a former All-American and winner of the Maxwell Trophy at Ohio State two years ago, was placed on waivers by the Pittsburgh Steelers Tuesday and claimed by the Minnesota Vikings.

Since coming to the Steelers as their top draft choice in 1962, Ferguson had been ineffective. He also was publicly berated by teammates and Coach Buddy Parker during his first season for his sub-par play.

In another waiver deal, the San Francisco Forty-Niners claimed tackle Clyde Brock from the Dallas Cowboys for the purpose of using him as an offensive lineman.

The Cleveland Browns announced that linebacker Mike Lucci has been placed on the injured reserve list and Stan Scuzek has been signed to replace him.

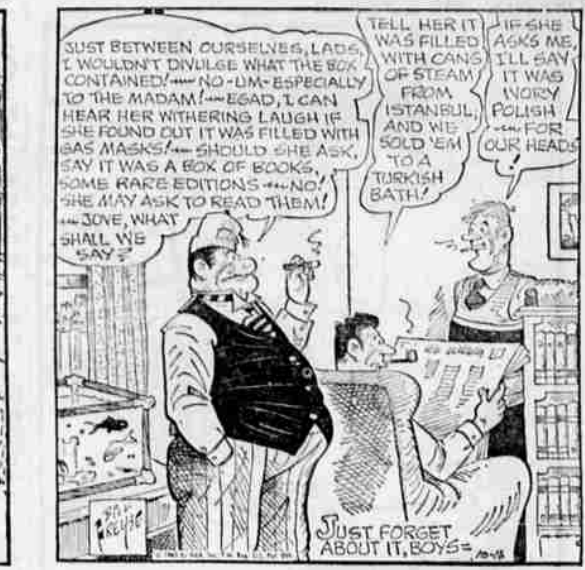
