Top year seen for potatoes

PRINEVILLE — The 1963 potato crop appears certain to be marked in Crook county's agricultural history as one of the county's really good years for spuds, according to Gus Woods, county agricultural agent.

Harvesting has begun on the 2700 acres planted to spuds in the county, with cropping on some ranches now in full swing. Woods stated that the growing season this year has seen nearly ideal weather conditions and that ranchers have had ample water throughout the season.

Some ranchers, for lack of an early frost to kill mature vines, have used chemicals or beaten down the vines mechanically, to insure harvest completion before the seasonal rains, generally expected in late October.

Woods said some showers now would not seriously hamper harvest operations on most ranches, though an early arrival of steady rains could present a more serious problem. Among individual ranchers, Orville Buckner's spud harvesting is well underway at the Stanley Brown and Joe Stahank ranches in the Prineville environs.
