A glance at the league standings and a quick look at the intermountain grid battles on the card this weekend announce that things are heading for a showdown here in Central Oregon.

Earlier this season mid-Oregon prep coaches were saying, "things will get hotter when the Central Oregon squads start playing each other." Well, we had one last week, and this Friday night we have a top donkeybrook.

Even Steven
It's here... time for a showdown. Two arch rival, win-hungry eleven, Prineville and Redmond, will don battle gear and commit grid mayhem on James Pollock Field in Redmond.

Prediction? It's a tossup.
Prineville's Cowboys and Redmond's Panthers both desperately need wins to stay out of the Intermountain basement. Currently Redmond is deadlocked with the Madras Buffs for the cellar honors with single wins against four losses.

Prineville is only half a rung better with a single win, three losses and a tie. The Cowboys are tied for seventh with the La Grande Tigers.

Cowboy Coach Bud Dowling today disclosed that his team is back on the field in full glory, completely recovered from the flu. The 'Pokes did suffer one bad break, however. This week the Prineville coaches learned Von Thompson, a hard-charging 190 pound junior fullback who has run every play as if his life depended on it, is through for the season. Thompson is currently under sedation at Pioneer Memorial Hospital and is suffering from a liver infection.

'Pokes Need Win
"We need this game badly," Dowling said, "... and I think my boys can do it." He disclosed a little "win-itis" wouldn't hurt the 'Poke cause in the least."

Over at Redmond, Coach Doc Savage doesn't have as much going for his Panthers as he would like. First string quarterback Paul Harvey, who missed last week's tilt at La Grande because of a possible ankle fracture, will be out of the picture again this Friday. Doctors still haven't been able to determine whether Harvey has merely a badly bruised ankle or a fracture.

Last week the Cats missed his services when the locals bowed to the La Grande Tigers. Wayne Marquess, an inexperienced but game reserve behind Harvey, will do the signal calling chores again this week. Jim Penhollow, guard, and Keith Birkhofer, end, both of whom have missed two games completely, will be available for some duty. Harold Kilgore will be back in at tackle.

Machau at End
Replacing Birkhofer at the end position will be John Machau. Terry Parkinson will do some alternating at the half-back spots. In the last few years, Prineville overwhelmingly has held the upper hand in the annual duel.

"We've never had any success," Savage said, "in getting Redmond up for the Prineville game." Perhaps the only thing that Savage has in the Cats' favor is that the tilt will be played at home.

Friday night offers another contest involving a Central Oregon team. Coach Frank Good's Madras Buffs take a trek north to the Columbia River to do battle with the up-surgeing The Dalles Indians. The Dalles was impressive last week in defeating the Prineville Cowboys 28-6. The Buffs took it on the chin from Bend, and will be out for revenge and a projection out of the IC cellar.

Indians Get Nod
The Dalles by 12. I say this

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mainly because the Indians are always tough on their home field. Besides that, however, The Dalles has the winning momentum behind it. The Indians have a well-balanced split T aggregation. Madras' chances ride on the shoulders of speedy Alvis Smith and on the Larry Barnes - to - Doug Stewart bomb. The Buff line will have to be at its best to contend with The Dalles' forward wall and rugged assaults of fullback Joe Petroff.

Saturday, however, offers the fracas that could shake up the whole league standings. It's Baker vs. Bend on new Bruin Field. Baker this week is clearly in second place. The Lava Bears are in a three-way deadlock for third.

Baker Favored
Baker by 7. Baker's Bulldogs are a spirited crew. Head Coach Ed Schenk has done a tremendous job of getting his Bulldogs at an emotional peak for each contest. Baker comes on like a fanatic invasion. Reports from other local coaches reveal that the Bulldogs play with almost reckless abandon. They don't throw much, but love to hit off tackle on the option pitch-or-keep play.

Baker has one of the best tackles in the prep grid business in Brian Evans, a 207 pound senior. Bend Coach Tom Wingblier calls him as the "best in the league." The Bulldogs have the same halfbacks as last year: Duane Barton and Mike Gardner. Bend led the Baker-ites last year at halftime 26-0, and Barton and Gardner combined talents in the second half to finish the game 26-20.

Bend should be in good shape for the game. Ace tackle Harvey Hillis will be ready to go for the first time in two weeks. Fullback Clyde Smith is healing his knee injury and may see some offensive action as well as defensive. (Last week he played only defense.)

8-Man Action
Up at Culver, Coach Clarence Namenuk's Bulldogs have suffered a bit of disaster. The Van Orsow brothers, Bob (a senior) and Dennis were injured in an auto accident last week and are lost for the season.

Bob Van Orsow's speed will be sorely missed by the Bulldogs tomorrow afternoon when they host Arlington in a league game. Dennis Van Orsow, though not a first stringer, was a real corner and a valuable reserve for 1963.

Culver will try to do without their services. Some lineup changes may have to be made to fill the void. Rick Urbach, all-around athlete, will be too much for the visitors, by himself however. Culver by 6.

PORTLAND (UPI) — Lewis and Clark's 21-7 upset of defending champion Linfield produced both the back and lineman of the week in the Northwest Conference this week.

Conference coaches today named Pioneer quarterback Bill Henselman the back of the week. He completed 9 of 14 passes of 150 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensive tackle Pete Dengenis of Linfield won the line award. Whitman's Bill Hilger took over the league's ground-gaining lead this week. He collected 120 yards against College of Idaho Saturday and now has 335 yards in 70 carries.

Dick Weise of Pacific is the passing leader with 31 completions in 54 attempts for 468 yards. Larry Miller of Linfield is the leading pass-catcher with 17 and Mickey Hergert of Lewis and Clark leads in scoring with 42 points on seven touchdowns.

BARCELONA, Spain (UPI) — Barcelona gained the second round of the European Cup of soccer winners tournament on Wednesday by completing an aggregate 5-1 victory over Shelbourne of the Republic of Ireland in the final game, 3-1.

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Palmer, Nicklaus 3-1 favorites in Sahara tourney

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (UPI) — Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus, who between them have monopolized professional golf for the past couple of years, were installed as 3-1 co-favorites today to win the \$70,000 Sahara Invitational.

The tournament got under way with 124 men teeing off on the Paradise Valley Country Club course — deep in the desert outside Las Vegas and seven miles away from the big gambling casinos.

The powerful field includes just about every top-notch golfer from the United States — with the exception of National Open Champion Julius Boros; plus most of the British Ryder Cup team.

Odds Against British
The book-makers uptown don't think much of the invaders from Britain because they have installed them at 20-1 odds.

Tony Lema, who has been giving Nicklaus and Palmer a run for their money, is rated

at 6-1; Bill Casper and Gene Littler at 8-1; and Paul Hareney and Jerry Barber at 10-1.

The Paradise course measures 7,038 yards.
"You can get long drives here, but it is necessary that they be kept straight," said Art Wall, the former Masters champion, after a practice round. "It is going to take a long, straight man off the tee to win. The roughs are exceptionally tough to get out of."

Webfoots ready for Arizona

EUGENE (UPI) — Oregon's Webfoots were pronounced ready today for their football game against the Wildcats of Arizona at Tucson Saturday.

It will be the fifth meeting between the two teams since 1937. Each has won twice. The last game, played in 1961 at Portland, saw Arizona come out on top 15-6.

Nicklaus and Palmer both rate in the "long" category, but they aren't always straight. George Bayer is real long, but he hasn't been able to keep on the fairways at all.

Don January, who is listed at 12-1 in the betting, is one of the straightest hitters and has been sharp in recent tourneys. He finished second in the Utah

Open; 10th in the Seattle Open and fifth in the \$125,000 White-marsh Open.

Lema also has been down the middle of the fairways all year and as defending champion may have an edge.

The 72-hole event will conclude on Sunday, with the final round televised in western states.

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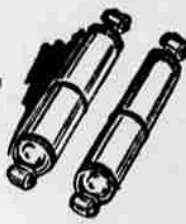
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
