SPOKANE (UPI) — The Fulbright scholar son of an African city official was refused a haircut in a barbershop here this week and his fellow students at Gonzaga University protested Thursday.

The barbershop owner said it was his long-standing policy not to cut Negroes' hair and he intended to continue that policy. The student, Jangaba Augustine Gus Johnson, 22, a freshman at Gonzaga, told the student council he went into the barbershop in one of the city's major business buildings at 1:10 p.m. Monday.

He said he was directed to a second chair by a barber already working and told to wait for another barber, expected to arrive soon. Johnson said the other barber did arrive, went into a back room and did not return until 2:15 p.m.

He said the second barber then told him he would not cut his hair and told him to leave because "there are white people waiting." John M. Wheeler, owner of the shop, said he was the barber who ordered Johnson to leave because he was a Negro.
