Nikita offers massive aid to Cuba

MOSCOW (UPI) — Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev has offered massive no-strings-attached aid to Cuba to alleviate hardships caused by recent flood and hurricane damage, the official Tass news agency reported today.

The offer, in a letter from Khrushchev to Premier Fidel Castro, said some of the aid will come from Soviet supplies already stockpiled in Cuba.

The letter said Soviet experts also will be dispatched to Cuba to assist in reconstruction work — fully at the expense of Russia.

(There had been speculation in western capitals that the Soviet Union was "going slow" in offering aid to Castro because of Cuba's refusal to sign the Moscow partial nuclear test ban agreement.)

(Some diplomatic sources had said Castro appeared to be playing one side against the other in Moscow's dispute with Peking where the test ban agreement has been denounced.)

Van Allen slide showing due at Council session

William Van Allen of Bend will be featured in the program of the Columbia Council of Camera Clubs, this weekend in Salem. The council will be holding its fifth annual convention, Saturday and Sunday, with headquarters at the Marion Motor Hotel.

Van Allen will give a 45-minute "photo essay" color slide presentation, "Jungle Run of the President Taft," following the Saturday night banquet. The showing consists of highlights of the 28,000-mile, four-month trip via freighter that he and Mrs. Van Allen made to the Orient.

The pictures include such exciting places as Manila, Saigon, Cambodia, Java, Singapore and Viet Nam. Van Allen gave a longer showing last spring at the Tower Theater in Bend.

The convention will bring together members of the 22 affiliated camera clubs in Oregon and southwest Washington. It will feature talks by eminent photographers both in black-and-white and color - slide mediums, several color - slide presentations, and judging of club prints and slides submitted for the annual competition.

There will be a field trip to Kay Woolen Mill for photography of the mill race, unusual architecture and industrial scenes.

Kenneth Cole, Salem, is convention chairman, and Mel Olmstead, The Dalles, will act as master of ceremonies. Al Gardner, Portland, is the 1963 Council president.

Van Allen, a member of Cascade Camera Club, has been named an associate of the Photographic Society of America, in recognition of outstanding contributions in the field. He is known particularly for his wildlife photos, many of which have won prizes.

Christmas visit set by Bob Hope

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Bob Hope is planning to entertain American troops in Viet Nam this Christmas.

The comedian said in making the announcement Wednesday that he was postponing a scheduled personal appearance tour of Australia and New Zealand.

He plans to take regular troupe members Jerry Colona, Anita Bryant and orchestra leader Les Brown on the tour.

Hope, who has been entertaining American armed forces in many parts of the world since World War II, said preparations for the Viet Nam appearances forced postponement of his commitments in Australia and New Zealand until February of next year.

Truckers get rate increase

SALEM (UPI) — Truckers engaged in city cartage freight business in 29 Oregon cities today were granted a temporary 4 per cent rate increase by the state public utility commission.

The increase is half what the truckers requested through their representative organization, the Oregon Draymen and Warehouse Association.

Commissioner Jonel C. Hill said the increase "is strictly interim relief." He ordered the association to be ready to appear at a hearing in nine months to determine whether the increase should be continued.

Hill termed the truckers' case as "poor."

He said it appeared some relief was needed, but that evidence presented at hearings did not support the increases requested.

The cities in which rates were increased are Albany, Ashland, Beaverton, Brownsville, Corvallis, Cottage Grove, Creswell, Eugene, Fairview, Gladstone, Grants Pass, Gresham, Junction City, Klamath Falls, Lake Oswego, Medford, Milton-Freewater, Milwaukie, Myrtle Point, Oregon City, Roseburg, Salem, Sandy, Springfield, Sutherlin, Sweet Home, Troutdale, Tualatin and West Linn.

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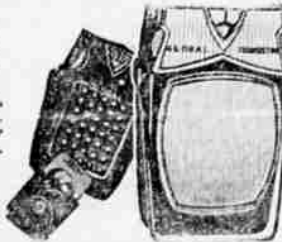
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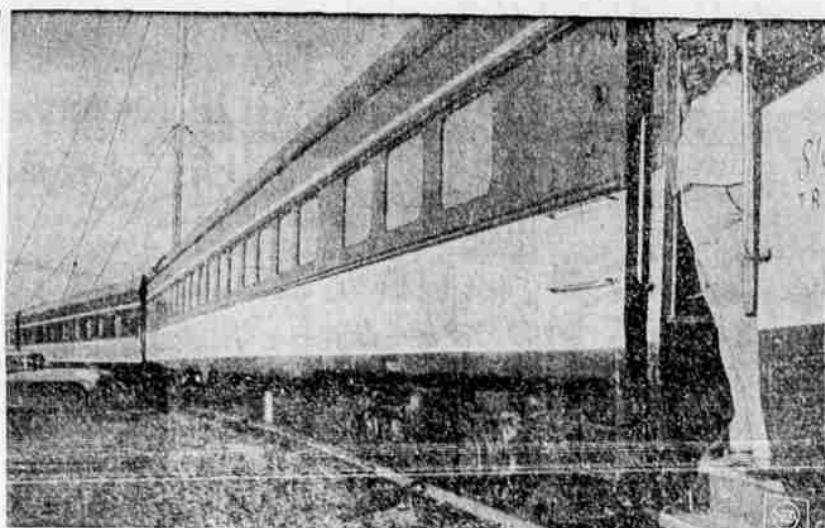
