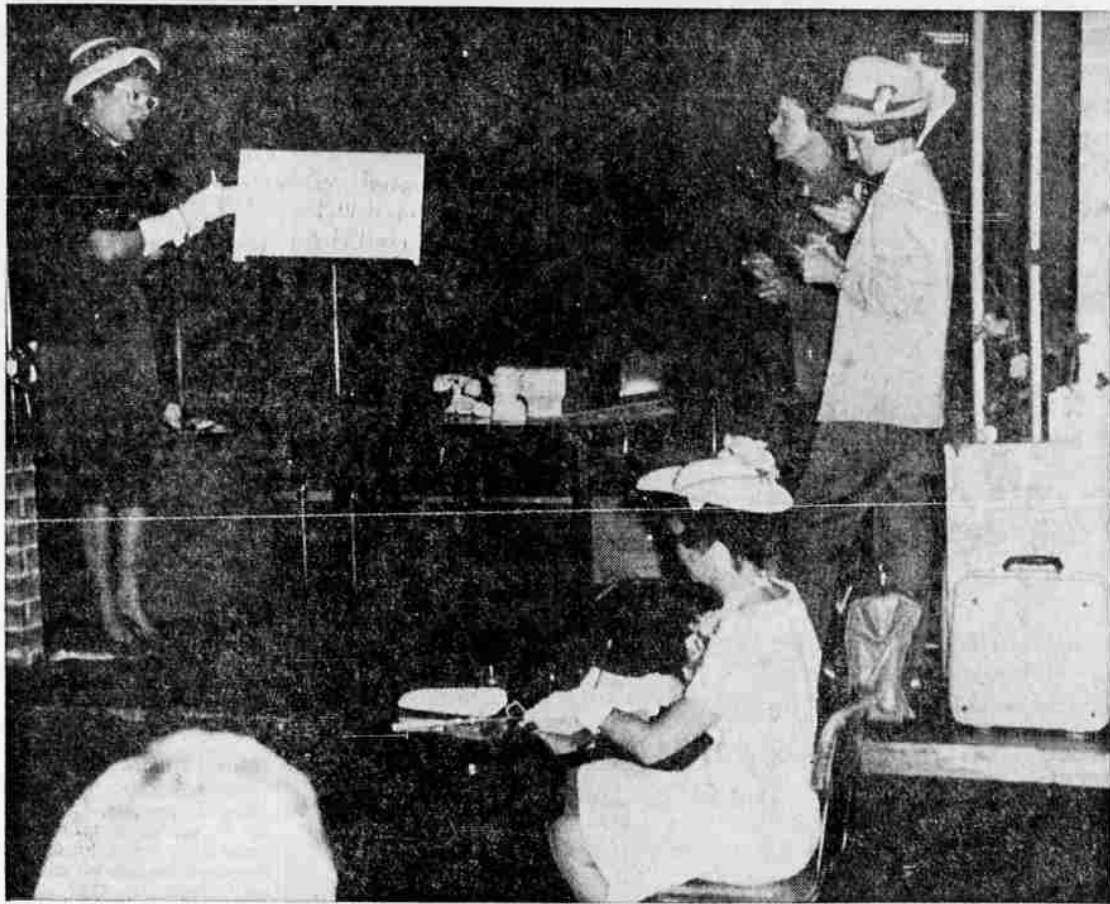

Mme. Nhu balks at cowboy sports on Texas ranch

BEEVILLE, Tex. (UPI)—Mme. Ngo Dinh Nhu of South Viet Nam roamed a real Texas cattle ranch today but balked on horseback riding and other cowboy sports.

Mme. Nhu, the sister-in-law of the South Viet Nam President Dinh Diem and wife of that country's military leader, spent the night at the plush ranch home of millionaire cattleman-oilman Dudley Dougherty.

Dougherty was scheduled to fly her to Austin today for a speaking engagement at the University of Texas.

The rancher flew Mme. Nhu to Beeville Wednesday after her arrival in Dallas, where she was greeted by pickets.

Her stay at the ranch is the only social visit of her U.S. speaking tour, during which she has lashed out at U.S. newsmen in Viet Nam, Harvard University, and what she called U.S. betrayal of President Kennedy's word.

The latter statement was made in Dallas as she waited for the plane to Beeville. She was referring to a State Department order which cut off the \$3 million annual allowance for aid to her husband's special forces.

A fun program was presented, with a number of amusing costumes and props featured. The "king" was given humorous gifts, and he in turn awarded prizes to George Rakestraw, Joe Larkin, Bradley Fancher and Rodney Glantz.

Student reports on Red captivity

BERLIN (UPI) — A blond Stanford University sophomore today told of his 21 months in Communist prisons for trying to help an East Berlin student "I didn't know personally" escape to the West.

Robert F. Mann, 20, of Sepulveda, Calif., was released by the East Germans Wednesday night.

He said he "accidentally" became involved with a "highly organized" West Berlin student organization and agreed to help in their escape network because "I saw an opportunity to do what was right."

The attempt to bring the East Berlin student through the wall on a borrowed Belgian passport failed, "possibly because we were observed, possibly because we were followed, possibly we were betrayed, perhaps it was accidental."

It was Mann's first assignment with the escape organization and the last. It led to six months of questioning, including three "unpleasant" months in solitary confinement and 15 months of prison work.

Now, Mann told a news conference, "I feel I should get back to my parents as soon as possible" and take up his interrupted university career.

Still looking somewhat tense after the strains of prison and his release late Wednesday, Mann spoke hesitantly but firmly.

"My treatment was relatively good," he said. "I was not mistreated. I was not beaten. I was not tortured."

"I was in solitary confinement for a while and that was very unpleasant."

Soviets say Reds on their side

MOSCOW (UPI)—The Soviet Union said today it can count on the support of more than two-thirds of the world's Communist parties in its ideological dispute with Communist China.

In the first numerical estimate of its strength made public here, the Soviet Communist party said in the magazine Kommunist that 65 Communist parties would back Moscow in any showdown with Peking.

There are believed to be about 86 parties, in and out of power, in the world. This would leave 21 either uncommitted or in the Chinese camp.

Diplomats said the showdown may come soon. The Communist leaders in Moscow for next month's anniversary celebrations of the Russian revolution are expected to discuss the dispute. Their meeting may result in one more try at reconciliation with Peking, and if this fails, in preparations for ousting the Chinese from the Moscow-led camp.

Such a move would almost certainly result in creation of a rival Communist international headed by Peking.

The Kommunist article spared no criticism of the Chinese. It accused the Chinese leadership of "defying" party leader Mao Tse-tung, Peking, it charged, was carrying out "subversive activities" against world communism.

Nevertheless, today's Pravda defended Peking's bid for a United Nations seat and attacked the U.S.-supported majority vote this week that rejected the bid for the 14th time.

Diana Churchill's death ruled as suicide

LONDON (UPI) — The Westminster coroner's office ruled today that Diana Churchill, eldest daughter of Sir Winston Churchill, committed suicide by taking an overdose of barbiturates.

The 54-year-old Miss Churchill, who resumed her maiden name after her 1960 divorce from Commonwealth Relations Secretary Duncan Sandys, was found dead Sunday in her apartment in the Westminster district of London.

An inquest was ordered, officials said at the time, because of some bottles found in the apartment.

Miss Churchill had three children from her marriage with Sandys.

"I record that she died of acute barbiturate poisoning,"

Neighbors said Diana Churchill was last seen Saturday night and seemed "gay and carefree." She did not appear ill, they said.

Miss Churchill was one of the first women in Britain to volunteer for wartime military service. She entered the Women's Royal Naval Service a few weeks after the start of the war in 1939 and later served with the Red Cross.

She was married twice, the first time to wealthy South African John Miller Bailey in 1932. They were divorced in 1935, the year she married Sandys.

AGREEMENT REACHED

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Cooks and stewards on West Coast ships will get \$1.05 an hour penalty pay in addition to their regular wages for all work at sea on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, according to an agreement reached here by the Marine Cooks & Stewards Union and Pacific Maritime Association.

The agreement makes the extra pay retroactive to Oct. 1, and is an application of a 7.85 per cent increase for each of the maritime unions.

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
