

NFL clubs to keep faith with home TV viewers

NEW YORK (UPI) — National Football League clubs will keep faith with their millions of home television viewers even though some may experiment with pay-TV in 1964 and 1965.

That was NFL Commissioner Pete Rozelle's pledge today following his announcement that the league's 14 clubs have been granted permission to experiment with presenting games on theater-TV screens in 1964 and 1965.

1965. Rozelle said the league's first experiment with theater-TV could be with its 1963 championship game Dec. 29.

In making the announcement, Rozelle emphasized the league's intention to continue its current policy of home television for all away games and for home games except within a 75-mile radius of the city in which the game is played.

"The fans in all 14 of our cities will see all their teams' away games as in the past," said Rozelle, "and the fans in non-league cities will continue to see our games in the same pattern as in recent years."

The difference in 1964 and 1965, however, will be that individual clubs will be able to experiment with theater-TV of their home games. The league's current regular-season contract with CBS forbids all use of pay-TV. The circuit's contract for its title game is with NBC.

"In the last month, in discussions with network officials and advertisers, I've said when we take bids for the new two-year contract for regular-season games we would reserve the right whether to use pay TV in blacked-out areas," said Rozelle.

Attles saw red — and some blood — in an elbow skirmish with Zelmo Beatty of the St. Louis Hawks Wednesday night. He returned to the court with a patch over his left eye and tossed in the key points that earned the Warriors a 99-93 victory at St. Louis.

The Hawks carried a 72-67 bulge into the fourth period when Attles and Beatty engaged in their skirmish. Attles shook off the injury quickly, tying the score at 74-all and then tossing in a follow-up basket to put San Francisco ahead to stay.

Attles finished with 19 points and teammate Wilt Chamberlain added 22. Bob Pettit was high man for the Hawks with 24.

The Los Angeles Lakers overcame a 19-point first period deficit in downing the Detroit Pistons, 124-116, and the Baltimore Bullets handed the New York Knickerbockers their fourth straight setback, 115-106 in other games.

The Pistons roared to a 28-9 lead in the opening minutes and were ahead 34-23 at the end of the first period. Then Jerry West and Elgin Baylor went to town to push the Lakers into a 57-54 halftime bulge. West scored 31 points, three more than Baylor.

Walt Bellamy's 45 points and

24 rebounds paced the Bullets to their victory over New York. Art Heyman, the Knicks' prize rookie, strained an ankle muscle in the first quarter and did not return to action.
