

# Berra to go for no monkey shines

NEW YORK (UPI) — Yogi Berra's new boss and whether they like it or not, New York Yankee players already are resigned to the fact he's no longer one of the boys.

Everyone from former teammate Joe DiMaggio on down seemed sure today the oft-comical 38-year-old Yogi will tolerate no monkey business and will crack down anytime there is any need to do so.

"He's not the clown that some have made him out to be," said DiMag, who played on the same club as Berra for six seasons.

"The men will play for him. They like him. He'll get the most out of them. He'll do a

good job."

Yankee players always loved to kid Yogi. Two of them, Mickey Mantle and Whitey Ford, even sent him a wire moments after co-owner Dan Topping named him the new manager Thursday.

The wire read: "We are hereby applying for our unconditional release. We want to become professional golfers."

It was signed "Mickey and Whitey."

The congenial Berra is a born gregarious. He loves to talk with everyone and anyone. Even when he was catching, he liked to ask rival hitters how their kids were doing in the Little League.

The big question in most minds now is whether Yogi suddenly can detach himself from the Yankee players as Ralph Houk did before him and as any manager must.

Phil Rizzuto, one of Berra's closest friends, thinks he can although he concedes it will be difficult.

"Yogi has a tough transition to make from being buddy-buddy with the ballplayers to being their leader," said the one-time Yankee shortstop.

"I know personally that all the players respect Yogi," he added. "Besides, he won't stand for any horsing around but I think the players think too

much of him to do that. Yogi is on the spot — he has to win and he has a lot of obstacles to overcome."

Berra took a cut, and considerable ribbing about it, also, to accept the Yankee manager's job. He earned \$45,000 as a player-coach last year and will work for \$32,500 next year, the same salary paid Casey Stengel and Houk in their first year as manager.

"The one-year contract was Yogi's idea," explained Topping.

"That's right," Berra corroborated. "If I can't do a job, I'll quit. If I'm good, I'll stick around a little longer."

## 4th ranked Illini at UCLA tonight

Illinois, ranked fourth in the nation with only a tie to mar its record, tackles the sophomore-studded UCLA Bruins tonight — a team which has grown old before its time this season.

The Bruins have lost to such powers as Pittsburgh, No. 3, by a field goal; Syracuse, No. 12, and Notre Dame, ranked 17th nationally, in playing one of the roughest schedules of any college football team.

Host UCLA features a wide-open offense, keyed by the passing and running of quarterback Larry Zeno and the pass-catching of end Mel Profit.

Illinois also has a rugged defense and is a 10-point favorite to win its fourth game and deal the ambitious Bruins their fifth loss in six games.

VMI visits Richmond in a Southern Conference contest — the only other major college action scheduled tonight. VMI, a loser to Navy last week, is 1-3-1 and Richmond is 2-3 although neither team has lost a conference game. VMI is a one-point choice.

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## If Bills can stop Boston, eastern race will tighten

The Eastern Division race in the American Football League will be tighter than a goal line stand if the Buffalo Bills can pluck enough talent from their injured list to halt the Boston Patriots Saturday night.

Boston has won its last two games in impressive style and currently shares first place with the Houston Oilers, each with 4-3 records. However, the last-place Bills have a 2-4-1 mark and can join in the race for the title by beating the Patriots at Buffalo.

The New York jets, third in the East with three victories and three defeats, entertain the Denver Broncos in another Saturday night contest.

Sunday's action sends the Oakland Raiders to San Diego for a meeting with the Western Division-leading Chargers and the Kansas City Chiefs to Houston.

The Bills, picked by many in pre-season polls to win the Eastern Division crown, have suffered a series of bad breaks and already list six players who are finished for the season. The latest serious injury was that

suffered by Roger Kochman in Houston last week.

The Patriots, on the other hand, are in excellent condition with the complete recovery of quarterback Babe Parilli. Parilli showed his best form last week when he completed 21 of 31 passes for 358 yards in a 40-21 victory over Denver.

Denver, in the Western Division cellar with a 2-4 record, features a strong running game led by fullback Billy Joe (5.2-yard average in 67 carries). Rookie quarterback Mickey Slaughter, who suffered a slight concussion last week, is expected to play, but if he's not ready the job will go to Don Breau, late of the San Diego taxicab squad.

The Jets, who have lost two straight on the road, will be glad to return to the Polo Grounds, where they've won all three of their games. Quarterback Dick Wood of New York will be getting his first crack at the team which released him just a few months ago.
