

'Pokes die hard

Pendleton trounces Prineville, 34-0

PRINEVILLE — Pendleton's mighty Buckaroos continued their winning ways last night as they scored in every quarter to overwhelm a game but helpless Prineville squad, 34-0.

Coach Don Requa's warriors looked like classy professionals from start to finish. The Buckaroo offense — featuring QB Dick Jones, Jack Baird and Steve Corey — might best have been described as a succession of explosions. It moved with the speed of a famished jaguar and the power of an incensed bull.

The Bucks collected 13 points before the first quarter was terminated, and picked up one in each succeeding stanza. Halfback Jack Baird recorded the

first as he plunged through the center of the Cowboy line from two yards out. His TD followed a brief series of scrimmage plays that originated when Pendleton took a Prineville punt on its own 15-yard stripe.

Jones Sweeps

From there Jones swept left end and rammed to the Cowboy 37 to put his mates in scoring contention. Only three additional plays were needed to punch the ball across. Baird then capped his own touchdown with a perfect conversion kick.

Prineville returned the kick to its own 35, but fumbled the ball into Buckaroo hands after managing its lone first down of the half. Pendleton then drove deep into Cowboy territory, but in turn fumbled it away to the hosts on their 14-yard stripe. Unable to move, the Cowboys punted to the Pendleton 43. From there the Bucks needed only three plays to move the pigskin to the enemy's 1. Fullback Corey slammed in for the second tally. This time Baird's kick went awry and the score stood 13-0.

The third Pendleton score came after the Cowboys stubbornly fought off two penetrations into their territory. Prineville was once again forced to punt, and Requa's ramblers found themselves on the mid-field stripe. On the first scrimmage play the battering Corey plunged through the center and sprinted 50 yards for the Buck's third mark. Baird's toe punctuated his effort, and at halftime Pendleton led 20-0.

In the second half the Cowboys gave their hometown fans a momentary thrill as halfback Bob Harris returned Pendleton's kick to his own 48. But once again they failed to gain meaningful yardage, and had to kick. A series of swift running plays brought the Buckaroos down to the Cowboy 5-yard stripe, where workhorse Corey gained his third TD of the night by smashing in from the five. Baird's conversion try split the uprights.

The final tally came on a 16-yard pass from QB Terry Harrison to Baird. It started in the fourth quarter following fullback Mike Carey's interception of a pass tossed by Cowboy signal-caller Greg Vernon. In moving the ball downfield from their own 27, the Bucks simply relied on the running abilities of Corey and Baird and the pinpoint passing of reserve quarterback Terry Harrison.

One Opportunity, Only
Prineville managed only once to set themselves up as a scoring threat, and failed to get the ball across. After intercepting a Harrison pass they drove to the Buckaroo 15 yard stripe. But Vernon, in attempting one pass, was mauled behind the line, and his next effort fell into the arms of the Buck's Carey.

For Prineville, it was mostly a defensive tussle.

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Joey Archer to file mid-weight title challenge

NEW YORK (UPI) — Irish Joey Archer, a superb boxer, will file a middleweight title challenge and \$2,500 check with the New York State Athletic Commission Monday, because of his controversial upset decision Friday night over slugger Rubin (Hurricane) Carter, top contender.

Dick Tiger of Nigeria is world champion.

Rangy, brown-haired Archer of New York staggered to a split victory over Carter of Paterson, N.J., who had 25-year-old Joey on the verge of a knockout in the final round at Madison Square Garden before 8,592 electrified spectators.

Their thrilling 10-round fight was not televised.

Archer, a 2-1 underdog, was awarded a split decision at the finish, for his seventh straight win. It was on a rounds basis as follows: Referee Arthur Mercante, 5-4-1, and Judge

Tony Castellano, 6-4. But Judge Al Berl had Carter ahead, 5-4-1. The United Press International also favored Carter, 5-4-1, and a poll of 16 writers at the ringside had Carter narrowly ahead, 8-7-1.

Archer weighed 161 pounds to 26-year-old Carter's 158.
