Vanquished Ducks now minus Renfro, Berry...

EUGENE (UPI) — Battered Oregon began getting ready for its football game with San Jose State here next Saturday — minus All-American halfback Mel Renfro, quarterback Bob Berry and tackle Milt Kanehe.

The three starting players were injured as the Ducks dropped a 26-19 decision to Washington before 35,699 in Portland Saturday.

Kanehe, a 6-3, 250-pound senior, suffered a fractured right ankle and probably will not be able to play in any of Oregon's four regular season games.

Renfro and Berry were listed as "doubtful" for the Ducks' next contest. Renfro received bad bruises on his right side and Berry suffered strained ligaments in his right knee. They were scheduled to undergo further examinations today.

Fullback Junior Coffey, starting his first game of the season, sparked the Huskies' win over the Ducks. He ran for 110 yards in 30 carries including touchdown bursts of 1 and 4 yards.

Missed Four Games
The 205-pound junior missed his team's first four games with a broken foot bone and carried the ball only four times in its

fifth contest. Coffey's 4-yard scoring run came with 3:48 remaining in the game and broke a 19-19 tie. Oregon Coach Len Casanova blamed "defensive mistakes" for the loss.

"We changed our defense a bit for this one and some errors we made really hurt us in the long run," he said.

Washington Coach Jim Owens said "this was a best ever effort by a Washington team for me...team effort and determination are the words to describe how we won it."

Berry threw 6 and 47 yards to end Dick Iwalle and 28 to end Rich Schwab for Duck touchdowns.

Oregon now has a 4-2 record for the season. The Huskies own a 3-3 mark.

Sisters Outlaws dump Culver 34-20

SISTERS — The victory bell rang out loud and clear here Saturday afternoon as the favored hometown Sisters Outlaws handled the visiting Culver Bulldogs and gained a 34-20 homecoming victory in 8-man football action this weekend.

Led by hard running junior halfback Steve Shehan, the Outlaws scored on their first two series of downs to take a quick 14-0 lead and hang on for the Deschutes loop win.

It was just a case of too much Shehan all afternoon as the quick-cutting back scored three touchdowns and had two others called back in downing their determined but out-classed arch-rivals from Culver.

Shehan struck fast, scoring the initial touchdown in the opening minutes of the contest.

Kickoff Returned

Culver returned the resulting kickoff to their own 24 yard line and advanced to their 38 with the aid of a pass interference call against Sisters. But there disaster struck when Culver's Rick Urbach fumbled and an alert Outlaw fell on it.

Seven plays later, with Shehan gaining most of the yardage, Quarterback Wayne Rowe spun off right tackle on a keeper play for the final six yards and the touchdown. Jeff Hiatt dove up the middle for the extra point.

Then Sisters came up with an unusual play that worked both times it was attempted, al-

though the Outlaws weren't able to capitalize on it with a TD. Still in the first quarter, the Outlaws had kick-off man Tom Smith try an on-side kick. The ball traveled the necessary ten yards before Smith fell on it. The Sisters squad caught the Bulldogs napping again in the second period when they recovered another on-side kick.

6 More for Sisters

No sooner had the second period gotten underway before Sisters struck for another six points. This time it was Hiatt who carried for the Outlaws, going 19 yards after taking a pitch-out from Rowe.

Now it was Culver's turn to get on the scoreboard as the visitors went 78 yards in nine plays for the score. Stan Earnest went the last three yards on an off tackle play for the TD. Earnest passed to Bob Simmons for the PAT.

The ensuing kickoff led to a series that saw no less than five touchdowns, four of which were brought back by the officials because of penalties.

It all started on the kickoff return. Hiatt took the kick on his own 32 and promptly reversed to Shehan who rambled 68 yards for an apparent TD. But there was a clipping penalty against Sisters on the Culver 18.

So Sisters took possession of the football on the Culver 33 yard line and promptly drove in for the score in five plays. Shehan went around right end for the final two yards and

Hiatt swept left for the extra point to put Sisters out in front 27-7.

On-Side Kick

This set the stage for the second Outlaw on-side kick, with Shehan falling on the ball on the Culver 46. Rowe then hit Shehan with a 30-yard pass that carried to the Culver 16 yard stripe. Rowe then passed to Rick Jacobsen for what appeared to be another TD. But Sisters was dinged 15 yards for illegal use of the hands and so had to try again from the Culver 31. This time Rowe chose to throw to Pat Hammack, who grabbed the aerial on the dead run and scooted into the end zone. Sisters, however, was off-side and so backed up another 5 yards to the 36.

Rowe dropped back to throw and it looked as though he might finally get the TD but Culver's Rick Urbach came out of nowhere to take the pass out of the hands of the intended receiver and head for paydirt.

Culver TD Cancelled

Culver fans "went wild" as it was apparent Urbach had scored as the gun sounded, ending the half, but their joy was premature. The officials ruled that Urbach stepped out of bounds on the Sisters 15.

The teams went into the dressing room during intermission with Sisters still leading 27-7.

The Bulldogs came out fighting mad and narrowed the score to 27-20 with a six-point

er in the third quarter and another in the early minutes of the fourth stanza.

Earnest scored the Bulldogs' second touchdown on a one yard scoot after he had passed to Urbach on a play that covered 64 yards.

In the fourth period Earnest threw to Urbach again, and the speedy halfback ran into the end zone on a play covering 85 yards. Earnest ran around right end for the extra point and the Bulldogs' final tally of the afternoon.

Shehan took all of the fire out of the Bulldogs' valiant attempt to rally when he went off tackle for nine yards and the final touchdown. Rowe ran the extra point.
