### Alcoholism subject of talk

Statistics on alcoholism in Oregon — and suggestions for combating it — were cited by an authority on the disease during a recent meeting of the Kenwood - Kingston PTA held at the Kingston School.

Gordon Rainey of the Oregon Mental Health Department, in his topic, "Alcohol and Youth," stated that one in every 15 high school students who drink becomes an alcoholic. He said there are 50,000 known alcoholics in the state of Oregon alone. Rainey added that no particular pattern of origin can be attributed to alcoholism because it arises from every type of environment.

Rainey concluded by urging instructors and parents to teach young people the reasons behind drinking and the symptoms of addiction. He warned against quoting misleading, foolish or "idiotic" rumors to youth.

### Texas lawmaker tells of fracas

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Rep. Ed Foreman, R-Tex., told the House that Rep. Henry Gonzalez, D-Tex., slugged him just outside the House chamber Tuesday after first threatening to pistol-whip him.

Foreman said Gonzalez "completely lost his head" in anger over comments Foreman made about Gonzalez' voting record in a speech last weekend at Houston before the Texas Federation of Republican Women.

Foreman, amplifying his account for newsmen, said Gonzalez approached him as he sat in the House during a quorum call and said he understood Foreman had called him a Communist.

Foreman said he replied that this was not correct, but that he had discussed Gonzalez' liberal voting record. Gonzalez shot back that if Foreman ever did make such a charge he would pistol-whip him, Foreman related.

Foreman said he replied, "well, Henry, why don't you get started?"

At that he said Gonzalez invited him outside the House chamber.

As they stepped through a door into the speaker's lobby he said Gonzalez swung at him, striking his right shoulder.

Foreman said he was not hurt and that he did not retaliate.

### Laws not enough to end prejudice, Hatfield notes

SALEM (UPI) — "We must remove prejudice from the minds and hearts of men, laws aren't enough," Gov. Mark Hatfield today advised the 12th annual intergroup relations forum here.

"We must attack the problem at the child's level—this is the battleground. Our rate of progress is being determined there."

Hatfield said he fully endorsed the federal civil rights program now before Congress, and admonished "I hope the President will not retreat from this program."

The governor noted that while the Negro is most identified with the "plight of the minority groups, we must not forget the Mexicans, Indians, the migratory labor force, the Jews and other religious groups."

Warning that "extreme right and left wing groups deliberately thrive on hate," Hatfield told the gathering of more than 100 "we must be concerned with all groups that are being victimized."

"Our task is not a simple one, but we can make equal opportunity for all men in our society."

He said the problems facing Negroes were economic, social and educational. There must be no barriers against Negroes who are qualified to compete for jobs, "and we must help equip the Negro to become qualified."

## Trapped miners won't be rescued before Thursday night or Friday

PEINE, Germany (UPI) — Three miners trapped more than five days 262 feet below the earth in a flooded iron mine will not be rescued before Thursday night or Friday morning, the mine manager said today.

Rudolf Stein, manager of the Mathilde mine, said gravel in a partially completed escape shaft was snagging steel pipe being lowered to line the hole and it may have to be re-drilled.

Rescue workers were trying to keep the full impact of the discouraging news from the miners below. But the men, all mine veterans, sensed something was wrong.

"Don't worry if you don't hear the drilling for a while," a rescue official told them on a telephone lowered through a drilled contact shaft. "We've got to put in steel piping and cement."

"That means another night down here," a miner below replied. He sounded glum, an official said.

The three men — Gerhard Hanusch, 43, Fritz Leder, 36, and Emil Pohlai, 34 — were reported in good condition in their nine-foot-wide chamber, where they were receiving food passed down a six-inch communications tube and taking pictures of each other with a camera sent down by United Press International.

Dotson was convicted by a jury last Thursday night in the fatal shooting of Camillus P. Lawrence, 67, outside Dotson's home April 10.

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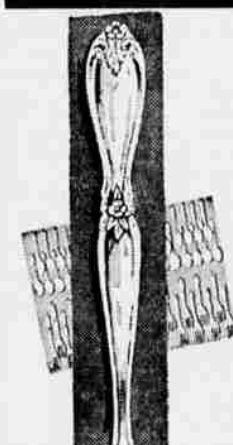
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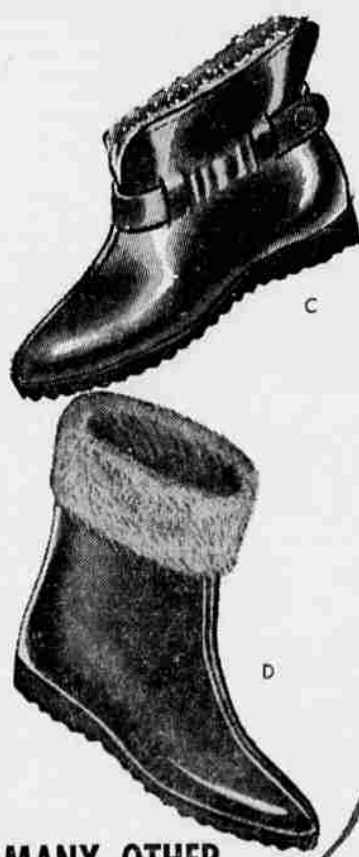
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
