Last Friday night's 32-0 shellacking of the Bend Lava Bears by The Dalles, put the Indians in the driver's seat for second place in the Intermountain loop.

Actually, the Indians currently are tied for the runnerup rung with Baker and Hermiston. Each have five wins and two losses. Baker and Hermiston, however, have yet to face almighty Pendleton, and that's enough to tip them out of the picture.

This puts The Dalles in the driver's seat with only Redmond and Mac Hi of Milton-Freewater remaining on the Indian war docket. Assuming the Indians will play with the dynamic force they have all season since their initial two defeats, the Columbia River crew should have little trouble dumping both opponents.

Redmond, The Dalles' opponent this Saturday, is expected to play it's heart out before a Homecoming throng. This weekend's tiff, therefore, lies as the chief obstacle.

Bend's defeat Friday night moved the Lava Bears down into sole possession of fifth place. The Bruins now have four wins and three losses.

Redmond's Panthers are riding all by themselves in sixth, but they have three wins against four defeats. Mac Hi is in seventh with a 2-5 win-loss record, while Prineville and La Grande are knotted for eighth with single wins against five defeats and single ties.

Madras is in the basement with a 1-6 win-loss mark. The Buffs, however, could climb right out of it by winning their last two ball games, and, upon the right circumstances, by winning just one of them.

Coach Frank Good's Madrasmen face Hermiston at home this weekend.

If Prineville loses to Bend Saturday, the basement prize will be decided the following weekend when Madras meets arch-rival Prineville in a season finale.

Weekend results: Sisters 34, Culver 20. Dufur 32, Cascade Locks 6. Arlington and Wheeler County played, but the outcome and score were not available.

Arlington's and Wheeler's win-loss record, therefore, here remains unchanged from last week.

Dufur cut loose at the Cascade Locks 8-man crew Friday and handed the Columbia River men a 32-6 lacing to all but clinch the Deschutes League championship.

It isn't known for sure what kind of a record it is, but local 8-man sources claim that it is to be the first league flag for the Dufur-men since the loop was formed.

This is born out by the defeat Dufur handed Sisters earlier this year. It was the first time in 13 years that Sisters lost to the boys up in Wasco County. Dufur, mentored by a new coach this season, has sailed through four straight opponents, and is expected to get little trouble Friday from the Arlington Honkers.

Last weekend also saw Sisters' Outlaws defend their Homecoming honor with a first half scoring blitz and a "hang on" for a 34-20 victory over Culver. Sisters' win knocked the Culver Bulldogs out of third spot into fourth, and the Outlaws moved past vanquished Cascade Locks into the runner-up spot. Both Arlington and Wheeler County are out of the picture.

Deschutes League final standings will be decided with the wrap-up tilts this weekend. Sisters and Cascade Locks will settle differences up on the Columbia River Friday and the tiff's winner will emerge as loop runnerup. Dufur is almost a cinch to whip Arlington.

If by some quirk of fate the Dufur-men don't and Sisters wins, the whole affair will end in a deadlock for first place. This is unlikely, however.

Moyer, Ayon fight to draw in 10-round go

SAN JOSE, Calif. (UPI) — Former middleweight champ Denny Moyer of Portland, Ore., and Mexican middleweight king Meno Ayon of Mexico battled to a highly unpopular 10-round draw Tuesday night.

The verdict was lustily booed by the 800 fans who thought that Moyer had gained the edge.

But referee Fred Apostoli of San Francisco, the only official, called the bout a 3-3 draw.

Moyer seemed to dominate the fight throughout as he pecked away with a good left jab. In the fifth Ayon sustained a cut over his left eye and bled off and on the rest of the way.

The Mexican had his best round in the final stanza when he rocked Moyer with hard rights, opening a small cut near his opponent's left eye.

Moyer weighed 157 1/2 and his foe 160 for the bout.

Eddie Cotton bolsters bid

FLINT, Mich. (UPI) — Seattle's Eddie Cotton strengthened his bid for a shot at the light heavyweight title held by Willie Pastrano Tuesday night by left-jabbing his way to a 15-round unanimous decision over Henry Hank.

Cotton, ranked as the No. 1 challenger to Pastrano, won the Michigan version of the light heavyweight crown before a meager crowd of 855 persons.

There were no knockdowns during the battle.

Cotton was never in trouble except in the ninth round when he was staggered by Hank's overhand right, but he managed to jab his way out of trouble.

Referee Jack Stein had Cotton winning 149-144. T. Ray Johnson of Flint scored it 148-137 in Cotton's favor and Francis Shepherd gave it to Cotton, 146-140.

San Francisco cut the Royal margin to five points late in the first half, but Robertson found the range and Cincinnati pulled out to an 11-point lead during the third period.

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Sagouspe out of Trojan lineup

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — The University of Southern California Trojans will have to face the Washington Huskies and probably the rest of their opponents this season without the services of starting center Larry Sagouspe.

Team physician Dr. Chester Semel said Monday he didn't think the 224-pound center and linebacker would recover for even the last game of the season.

Sagouspe suffered a torn cartilage in his knee in last Saturday's 36-6 romp over California. Dr. Semel said the leg was placed in a cast, but recovery from this type of injury was slow.

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
